MINUTES

July 16, 2020

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy (Board) met at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 16, 2020 at the Hilton Hotel conference room, 1001 East County Line Road, Jackson, MS 39211. The meeting was held at the Hilton Hotel to accommodate the spacing needed due to COVID restrictions. The following members were present: Ryan Harper – President, Jillian Foster – Vice-President, John T. Barrett - Secretary, Guy Phillips, James L. Calvert, Ronnie Bagwell and Tony Waits.

After being appointed by the Governor and approved by the Senate, Board members Ronnie Bagwell and Tony Waits were given the oath of office and sworn in as new board members.

The Board held elections for Board officers. The following members were elected unanimously:

Vice-President – Larry Calvert
Secretary – Todd Barrett

The Board made a special presentation to Ryan Harper in recognition for serving as President of the Board for the past year.

Special Guest Connor Reeves made a presentation to the Board on the upcoming voter initiative to amend the Constitution to allow medical marijuana. At the conclusion of the presentation, upon a motion by Barrett and a second by Harper, the Board voted unanimously to go into executive session to discuss the possible litigation that could arise if the Board takes an official position on the subject matter. Upon returning to open session, the Board announced that no votes and no action was taken during the executive session.

CONCLUSION OF CONSENT AGENDA

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Susan McCoy, Executive Director, reported to the Board that staff had been working diligently under special circumstances due to the COVID-19 pandemic with several staff members working

from home and coming to the office on an "as needed" basis. Protective measures have been taken around the office to ensure that the working conditions are safe for employees. Stephanie Mueller, PMP Director was recognized for five years of service to the Board. The legislature had renewed the Practice Act and the legislature had approved the budget for the new fiscal year. The agency Policy and Procedure Manual has been updated. The new licensing system is progressing well and we hope to have it operational soon.

REGULATION WORKING GROUP

The following regulation amendments were presented to the Board for consideration:

- Part 3002, Chapter 8: Background Checks (see attached)
Without objection, the Board approved this Rule as final and directed the staff to proceed with adoption pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act.
- Article IV Licensure Renewal and Continuing Education (see attached)
Without objection, the Board approved its intent to adopt the amendment and directed the staff to proceed with adoption pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act.
- Article VII Responsibility of the Pharmacist-in-Charge (PIC) (see attached)
The Board approved its intent to adopt the amendment and directed the staff to proceed with adoption pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act. Board member Guy Phillips voted against removing paragraph B.4.
- Article XLVIII Telepharmacy (see attached)
The Board approved its intent to adopt the new regulation and directed the staff to proceed with adoption pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act. Board member Ronnie Bagwell voted against the new regulation.
- Article XX Partial Filling of Schedule II Prescriptions (see attached)
Without objection, the Board approved this regulation amendment as final and directed the staff to proceed with adoption pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Andrew Swinney made a presentation proposing a new pharmacy service providing remote pharmaceutical care. The Board took no action on the proposal.

Following a discussion, the Board considered a motion to list Gabapentin as a drug of concern to be reported to the Prescription monitoring Program. Board members Todd Barrett, Ryan Harper and Tony Waits voted for the motion and Board members Ronnie Bagwell, Guy Phillips, Jillian Foster and Larry Calvert voted against the motion. The motion failed.

No action was taken following a discussion of whether to remove the probation status listed on the website for pharmacists who are on probation.

Following a discussion, the Board voted unanimously to waive the requirement that two (2) hours of continuing education must be "live CE" for the 2020 licensure period due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The requirement to obtain fifteen (15) total hours is still in effect but there is no live CE requirement for 2020.







JURISDICTION

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy has jurisdiction of the subject matter and person of Regina M. Medlin, Pharmacy Technician Registration Number PT-217030, pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Regina M. Medlin, Pharmacy Technician Registration Number PT-217030, is alleged to have committed the following violation:

Mississippi Board of Pharmacy Administrative Rules, Rule 2.1 O:

The theft or embezzlement of prescription drugs, controlled substances, medical devices, or funds from a permitted facility.

Specifically, Medlin admitted to taking Norco 10 and Norco 7.5 from the Walgreens pharmacy where she worked. Medlin surrendered her pharmacy technician registration on February 28, 2020.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) That the "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges was served pursuant to Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated;
- (2) That the Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law;
- (3) That the Respondent was issued a pharmacy technician registration by the Board, Pharmacy Technician Registration Number PT-217030, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated;
- (4) That the Respondent committed the violation as charged; and
- (5) That the Respondent voluntarily surrendered her pharmacy technician registration.

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondent and a copy maintained in the office of the Board.

- The Board officially accepts the voluntary surrender of Pharmacy Technician Registration Number PT-217030;
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103 (1)(b), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Pharmacy Technician Registration Number PT-217030 is revoked;
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103 (2), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall have the right to petition the Board for reinstatement of her registration. The Board will not consider a petition for reinstatement of this registration until at least six (6) months from the date of this Order.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay and the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).
- The total monetary penalty and cost of investigation in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) shall be paid by the Respondent prior to the reinstatement of her registration.

Every facility/business that engages in the wholesale distribution of prescription drugs, to include without limitation, manufacturing in this state, distribution into this state, or selling or offering to sell in this state, or distribution from or within this state, and **every reverse distributor located in or outside this of state that conducts business with pharmacies in this state, shall register biennially or annually, to be determined by the board, with the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy by applying for a permit on a form supplied by the board and accompanied by a fee as set by subsection (4) of this section.**

Specifically, Environmental Enterprises, Inc. conducted business as a reverse distributor for Diamondhead Health Mart Pharmacy, LLC, Pharmacy Permit No. 14221/1.1 on July 26, 2019 and has not obtained a permit from the Board to operate as a reverse distributor.



The board shall adopt regulations for the distribution and sale or rental of home medical equipment, legend devices and medical gases that promote the public health and welfare and comply with at least the minimum standards, terms and conditions of federal laws and regulations. The regulations shall include, without limitation:
 - (f) Minimum standards of operation and professional conduct to include, but not be limited to:
 - (i) Employment of qualified personnel to properly render medical equipment services in the manner prescribed by law;
 - (ii) Suitable facilities shall be maintained to house inventory, to allow for equipment maintenance work-space and the storage and retrieval of all records required to be kept;
 - (iii) A copy of these regulations shall be present in the facility at all times;

- (iv) The facility is kept in a clean, orderly and sanitary condition at all times;
