Eugene F. Brown, Pharmacist Certificate of Registration Number E-05698, is alleged to have committed the following violation:

Mississippi Board of Pharmacy Administrative Rules, Rule 2.1, F:

Violation of any of the provisions of the Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Act or rules or regulations adopted pursuant to such Act; or violation of pharmacy or drug laws of any other state or the federal government or the rules/regulations pertaining thereto.

Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations ARTICLE VII, RESPONSIBILITY OF PHARMACIST-IN-CHARGE (PIC), Paragraph 5, C:

5. On the premises where a pharmacy is maintained in conjunction with other services or business activities, the pharmacy shall be physically secured from such other services or activities during those times a pharmacist is not present and the pharmacy is not open, and other services or activities are being provided on the premises.

A. The Pharmacy shall be secured by a physical barrier to detect entry at a time when the Pharmacist is not present.

B. Each pharmacist while on duty shall be responsible for the security of the Pharmacy, including provisions for effective control against theft or diversion of Drugs and/or Devices.

C. The pharmacist-in-charge shall be responsible for adequate security being maintained on drugs in all areas of the permitted facility at all times and is responsible for reporting any loss or suspected loss of controlled substances or legend drugs directly to the Board immediately (this does not relieve any pharmacist who discovers a loss from the requirement of reporting the loss directly to the Board).

Specifically, an accountability audit was conducted on March 12, 2021, by the Compliance Division of the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy. The audit revealed numerous drug shortages and

overages of controlled substances. Eugene F. Brown, Pharmacist Certificate of Registration Number E-05698, was the pharmacist-in-charge and responsible for the security of the drugs.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges was hand delivered to the Respondent more than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing.
- (2) The Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law.
- (3) The Respondent was issued a pharmacist license by the Board, Pharmacist License, Certificate of Registration Number E-05698, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (4) The Respondent committed the violation as charged.

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondent and a copy maintained in the office of the Board.

- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(i), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, a monetary penalty in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) is imposed on the Respondent.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, the cost of investigation and conduct of a hearing in the amount of One Thousand Three Hundred Forty-Six Dollars and Thirty-Three Cents (\$1,346.33) is imposed on the Respondent.
- The total monetary penalty and cost of investigation shall be paid within thirty (30) of this Order.
- Respondent shall be required to obtain Five (5) hours of continuing education on the issue of recordkeeping of controlled substances prior to December 31, 2022. Respondent must provide proof of completion of these continuing education hours to the compliance director of the Board. These continuing education hours shall be in addition to the annual continuing education hours required by regulation.
- Respondent shall be responsible for conducting an quarterly inventory and reconciliation audit of all controlled substances at Brown's Discount Drugs, Permit #01002/1.1. the inventories shall be conducted by the end of the months of February 2022, May 2022, August 2022 and November 2022. A report of the inventory and audit shall be submitted to the compliance director of the Board.

C. Shantelle Williams, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number T-11919, is alleged to have committed the following violation:

Mississippi Board of Pharmacy Administrative Rules, Rule 2.1 H:

Failure to comply with lawful orders of the Board.

Specifically, the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy entered an Order dated September 15, 2011 (attached), which placed certain conditions and restrictions on C. Shantelle Williams, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number T-11919. The Order provided in part:

Further, that the following conditions and restrictions are placed on Ms. Williams:

- (1) That she abstain from the use of alcohol or the unauthorized use of controlled substances or other habit forming legend drugs; and
- (2) That for an indefinite period of time, that she submit a urine specimen when requested by the Board or any agent of the Board of Pharmacy; and
- (3) That for an indefinite period of time, that she submit a serum specimen when requested by the Board or any agent of the Board of Pharmacy, and
- (4) That for an indefinite period of time, that she submit a hair sample when requested by the Board or any agent of the Board of Pharmacy; and
- (5) That during the period of probation, that she must keep the Board informed at all times as to the time and place of her employment as a pharmacist; and further, that she submit a quarterly report in writing to the Board detailing personal and professional well-being; and
- (6) That during the period of probation, that she shall not take any drug, which has not been prescribed for her. That, except in an emergency, before ingesting any drug which has been prescribed, she shall inform the Executive Director

or a Compliance Agent orally, by phone or by other means. That she follow this by written notice to the Executive Director of the Board within twentyfour (24) hours, stating the name of the drug ingested, the number and strength of the doses prescribed, the dosage regimen and the name and registration number of the prescriber; and

- (7) That she shall be in compliance with all state and federal laws and regulations of the Board; and
- (8) Further, that Ms. Williams' Failure to Comply with the terms of this AGREEMENT or her Contract with the Mississippi Association of Recovering Pharmacists (MARP) will result in the immediate suspension of her Pharmacist License.

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy entered an additional Order dated September 21, 2017 (attached) which commuted the probationary period of the prior Order and extended all other terms of the prior Order until December 2020. The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy entered an additional Order dated September 17, 2020 (attached) which extended all terms of the 2011 Order, except probation, until December 31, 2021. On August 2, 2021, Jerry Fortenberry, Executive Director of MARP, notified the Board that Williams had a positive drug screen for benzodiazepines. During an interview with Compliance Agent Raymond Keith, Williams admitted to taking lorazepam 0.5 mg that was prescribed for her daughter. Williams stated she took the drug because she needed help sleeping.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges was served pursuant to Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (2) The Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law.
- (3) The Respondent was issued a pharmacist license by the Board, Pharmacist License, Certificate of Registration Number T-11919, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (4) The Respondent committed the violation as charged.

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondent and a copy maintained in the office of the Board.

- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(a), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, the Pharmacist License, Certificate of Registration Number T-11919 is suspended indefinitely.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(i), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, a monetary penalty in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) is imposed on the Respondent.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, the cost of investigation and conduct of a hearing in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) is imposed on the Respondent.
- The total monetary penalty and cost of investigation shall be paid within thirty (30) of this Order.

• Respondent's license shall not be reinstated until the Respondent obtains an addiction evaluation from a facility approved by the Board and presents the evaluation report to the Board.
