STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Austin W. McQuirk, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-16110, is alleged to have committed the following violation:

Mississippi Board of Pharmacy Administrative Rules, Rule 2.1 J:

Addiction to or dependence on alcohol, controlled substances or other habit forming legend drugs or the unauthorized use, possession or theft of controlled substances or other habit forming legend drugs;

Specifically, Austin W. McQuirk, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-16110, was arrested for DUI on October 10, 2020 and again on March 28, 2021. McQuirk surrendered his license on March 28, 2022.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

(1) The "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges was served pursuant to Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.

(2) The Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law.

- (3) The Respondent was issued a pharmacist license by the Board, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-13110, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (4) The Respondent did not appear for the hearing and the hearing was held in absentia.

(5) The Respondent committed the violation as charged.

(6) The Respondent voluntarily surrendered his pharmacist license.

 - B. Any act by any person in the conduct of the activities of the facility which is a violation of the rules and regulations of the Board of Pharmacy.

Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations Article VIII RESPONSIBILITY OF PHARMACIST/PHARMACIST CARE, paragraph 1, C. (5):

1. In the dispensing of drugs, the pharmacist shall have the following responsibilities:

C. In the dispensing of medications for ambulatory (or outpatients):

(5) A pharmacist shall not actively supervise more than three pharmacy technicians at one time.

Specifically, on December 7, 2021, Compliance Agent Sid Seal observed five (5) pharmacy technicians working with only one pharmacist on duty at the time.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Pursuant to discussions between Board Counsel and the Respondent, an Agreement to Settle this matter is found to be in the best interest of all parties involved. It is hereby Agreed as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- That the Respondent was properly notified of the charges by a duly processed "Notice of (1) Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges as provided for in Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and the Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law;
- That the Respondent was issued a permit to operate as a pharmacy by the Board, Permit (2) Number 08186/1.2, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (l)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated;
- (3) That the Respondent does not contest the violation as charged, and,
- That the Respondent agrees to the disciplinary action stated below as imposed by the Board. (4)

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

- Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) as a settlement of all claims alleged by the Board in this matter.
- Respondent shall pay the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).
- The total monetary settlement and cost of investigation shall be Six Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$6,250.00). The monetary settlement and cost of investigation is due and payable in the office of the Board within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Order.

Count 1:

Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations Article XXV, INVENTORY REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES, Paragraph 1:

1. If a facility has a loss of controlled substances, a complete inventory of all remaining controlled substances shall be made within forty-eight (48) hours of discovery of the loss of controlled substances. This inventory shall be dated and signed by the pharmacist conducting the inventory. Any loss or suspected loss of controlled substances shall be reported directly to the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy immediately upon discovery and a written report made to the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy within fifteen (15) days; this written report shall include a copy of the inventory required by this ARTICLE.

Specifically, an initial controlled substance loss notification was sent to the board on 9/24/21 but no additional follow up was received. Cycle count on 10/25 suggested missing #100 count bottle of alprazolam 2 mg.

Count 2:

Mississippi Board of Pharmacy Administrative Rules, Rule 2.1 V:

Jeopardizing, compromising, interfering or failing to cooperate with any lawful investigation conducted by the Board or any state or federal regulatory or law enforcement agency.

Specifically, CVS corporate offices refused to allow the pharmacist-in-charge to provide a written statement of the circumstances involving the loss of controlled substances.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) That the Respondent was properly notified of the charges by a duly processed "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges as provided for in Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and the Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law;
- (2) That the Respondent was issued a permit to operate as a pharmacy by the Board, Permit Number 08266/1.2, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (l)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated;

1. The person who signs the application for a pharmacy permit or the renewal of a pharmacy permit shall be the pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) for that facility.

A. Authority. The PIC of the pharmacy shall be responsible for complete supervision, management and compliance with all federal and state pharmacy laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy in the entire prescription department. He/She shall have the cooperation and support of all pharmacy staff in carrying out these responsibilities. The pharmacist-in-charge is responsible for assuring that all personnel are properly registered or licensed with the Board and that all pharmacy permits are current and appropriate for the type of pharmacy operation being conducted.

Specifically, an inspection of Clint's Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 01781/1.1 on December 9, 2021 revealed that Danyll Summerall was performing pharmacy technician duties when her pharmacy technician application had been denied by the Board. Clint Bane, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-07204, was the pharmacist-in-charge of Clint's Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 01781/1.1. As the pharmacist-in-charge, Bane was responsible for assuring that all pharmacy technicians were properly registered. A violation by the pharmacist-in-charge also amounts to a violation against the permit.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The Respondents were properly notified of the charges by a duly processed "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges as provided for in Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and the Respondents have been afforded all due process required by law;

PERMIT TO OPERATE AS A PHARMACY, PERMIT NUMBER 01781/1.1 LICENSE TO PRACTICE PHARMACY, REGISTRATION NUMBER E-07204

JURISDICTION

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy has jurisdiction of the subject matter and person of Clint's Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 01781/1.1, and Clinton E. Bane, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-07204, pursuant to Section 73-21-97(1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Clint's Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 01781/1.1, and Clinton E. Bane, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-07204 are alleged to have committed the following violation:

Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations Article IX ACTION AGAINST PERMITS, Paragraph 1, B:

- The Board of Pharmacy may refuse to issue or renew, or may suspend, summarily suspend, place on probation, revoke, reprimand, or restrict the permit of any permitted facility and/or impose a monetary penalty upon one or more of the following grounds:
 - B. Any act by any person in the conduct of the activities of the facility which is a violation of the rules and regulations of the Board of Pharmacy.

Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations Article VII RESPONSIBILITY OF PHARMACIST-IN-CHARGE (PIC):

1. The person who signs the application for a pharmacy permit or the renewal of a pharmacy permit shall be the pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) for that facility.

A. Authority. The PIC of the pharmacy shall be responsible for complete supervision, management and compliance with all federal and state pharmacy laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy in the entire prescription department. He/She shall have the cooperation and support of all pharmacy staff in carrying out these responsibilities. The pharmacist-in-charge is responsible for assuring that all personnel are properly registered or licensed with the Board and that all pharmacy permits are current and appropriate for the type of pharmacy operation being conducted.

Specifically, an inspection of Clint's Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 01781/1.1 on December 9, 2021 revealed that Danyll Summerall was performing pharmacy technician duties when her pharmacy technician application had been denied by the Board. Clint Bane, License to Practice Pharmacy, Certificate of Registration Number E-07204, was the pharmacist-in-charge of Clint's Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 01781/1.1. As the pharmacist-in-charge, Bane was responsible for assuring that all pharmacy technicians were properly registered. A violation by the pharmacist-in-charge also amounts to a violation against the permit.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The Respondents were properly notified of the charges by a duly processed "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges as provided for in Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and the Respondents have been afforded all due process required by law;
- (2) Respondent #1 was issued a permit to operate as a pharmacy by the Board, Permit Number 01781/1.1, and Respondent #2 was issued a License to Practice Pharmacy Registration Number E-07204 and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (l)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated;
- (3) The Respondents committed the violations as charged.

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondents and a copy maintained on file in the office of the Board.

- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(i), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent #1 shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent #1 shall pay the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).
- The total monetary penalty and cost of investigation in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) shall be paid by Respondent #1 within thirty (30) days of this Order.

- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(i), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent #2 shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent #2 shall pay the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).
- The total monetary penalty and cost of investigation in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) shall be paid by Respondent #2 within thirty (30) days of this Order.
