Board Member Ronnie Bagwell moved to close the meeting to determine if the Board should declare an executive session. All Board Members voted in favor of the motion. Upon a motion by Board Member Mike Gilbow, 2nd by Board Member Craig Sartin the Board voted unanimously to go into executive session in accordance with Section 25-41-7(4)(b) and (d) for the purposes of discussing potential litigation stemming from the adoption of a rule and to discuss investigative proceedings by the Board regarding an allegation of violations of the law. On a motion by Board Member Jillian Foster, 2nd by Board Member David Hudson, the Board voted unanimously to rise from executive session and enter open session. It was reported that no action was taken during the executive session.

Upon recommendation by staff, the Board adopted Article XXXVIII as a proposed regulation and voted to repeal Article XLII without objection.

Upon a motion by Board Member Tony Waits, 2nd by Board Member David Hudson, the Board voted to withdraw Article XLIX and Definitions from consideration of the OLRC and its filing with the Office of the Secretary of State. Board Members Ronnie Bagwell, Tony Waits, Jillian Foster, Craig Sartin, David Hudson and Mike Gilbow voted in favor of the motion. Board Member Ryan Harper voted against the motion.

Upon recommendation by staff, the Board approved proposed changes to the Pharmacy Practice Act and the Pharmacy Benefit Prompt Pay Act.

Upon motion by Board Member Tony Waits, 2nd by Board Member Jillian Foster, the Board unanimously approved an Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding with Medicaid regarding the use of Prescription Monitoring Program data pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 73-21-127 (e)(i).

Upon motion by Board Member Ryan Harper, 2nd by Jillian Foster, the Board unanimously approved a temporary policy for certain parenteral drug products compounded by pharmacy compounders not registered as outsourcing pharmacies.

Upon motion by Board Member Tony Waits, 2nd by Board Member Ryan Harper, the Board unanimously approved to amend the Pharmacy Benefit Manager Audit Services Contract with Horne, LLP to increase compensation by Twenty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00) to pay for the additional services requested by the Board in an Amendment to the Contract.

~~(b) Disciplinary action by the board against a business or any person holding a permit under this section shall be in accordance with Section 73-21-9.~~

2. Definitions. For the purposes of this Article:

- a. "Home medical equipment" means technologically sophisticated medical equipment and devices usable in a home care setting, including, but not limited to:
- i. Oxygen for human consumption, oxygen concentrators and/or oxygen delivery systems and equipment;
 - ii. Ventilators;
 - iii. Respiratory disease management devices;
 - iv. Electronic and computer driven wheelchairs and seating systems;
 - v. Apnea monitors;
 - vi. Transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulator (TENS) units;
 - vii. Low air loss cutaneous pressure management devices;
 - viii. Sequential compression devices;
 - ix. Neonatal home phototherapy devices;
 - x. Feeding pumps; and
 - xi. Other similar equipment as defined in regulations adopted by the Board.

The term "home medical equipment" does not include medical equipment used in the normal course of treating patients by hospitals, hospices, long-term care facilities or home health agencies, or medical equipment used or dispensed by health care professionals licensed by the State of Mississippi if the professional is practicing within the scope of his or her professional practice. In addition, the term does not include items such as upper and lower extremity prosthetics, canes, crutches, walkers, bathtub grab bars, standard wheelchairs, commode chairs and bath benches.

- b. "Home medical equipment services" means the delivery, installation, maintenance, replacement, and/or instruction in the use of home medical equipment, used by a sick or disabled individual, to allow the individual to be cared for and maintained in a home or noninstitutional environment.
- c. "Medical gas" means those gases and liquid oxygen intended for human consumption.
- d. "Order" means an order issued by a licensed practitioner legally authorized to order home medical equipment, legend devices and/or medical gases.
3. In addition to the requirements provided in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 73-21-108(2), Medical Equipment Supplier Permits shall have the following requirements:
- a. ~~No person, business or entity located in this state or outside of this state that is subject to this section shall sell, rent or provide or offer to sell, rent or provide directly to patients in this state any home medical equipment, legend devices, and/or medical gas unless such person, business or entity first obtains a Medical Equipment Supplier Permit from the board.~~
 - b. ~~The permitting requirements of this section apply to all persons, companies, agencies and other business entities that are in the business of supplying home medical equipment to patients in their places of residence and that bill the patient or the patient's insurance, Medicare, Medicaid or other third party payor for the rent or sale of that equipment.~~
 - e. ~~The board shall require a separate permit for each facility location directly or indirectly owned or operated in this state. a. Permits shall not be issued for facilities located in a residence.~~

- d. The application for a permit shall be made to the board on a form supplied by the board and shall be accompanied by a fee of not more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), as prescribed by the board. Once issued, every permit must be renewed annually, and the renewal fee shall be not more than One Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00), as prescribed by the board.
- e. All permits issued under this section shall expire annually on June 30 of each year. Applications for renewal must be made to the board on or before June 30 and must be accompanied by the fee as prescribed by the board. A late renewal fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) shall be added to all renewal applications received by the board after June 30 of each renewal period. The permit shall become void if the renewal application, renewal fee and the late renewal fee are not received by the board by September 30 of each year.
- f. b. The person who signs the application for a medical equipment suppliers permit or the renewal of a medical equipment suppliers permit shall be the permit holder for that facility and shall be responsible for all activities in the permitted facility which are subject to regulation by the Board. Once issued, a permit cannot be amended, transferred or assigned to another person until a new application is filed and a new updated/amended permit is issued by the Board.
- g. c. If the employment of a permit holder is terminated or if for any other reason he/she wishes to be relieved of the responsibilities of the permit holder, he/she must return remove his/her name from the medical equipment suppliers permit through the Board Licensing Gateway to the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy with written notice that he/she is no longer the permit holder for that facility. When a permit holder is removed from the medical equipment suppliers permit, an application for a new permit for that facility must be made to the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy within ten (10) days. If a new updated/amended permit is not obtained within ten (10) days, the permit becomes inactive and no business may be conducted until a new permit is issued by the Board.
- h. d. If a permitted facility is permanently closed or has a change of ownership, the permit holder for that facility shall give notice to the Board of the effective date of closure or change in ownership at least ten (10) days prior to the closure or change of ownership. "Change of ownership", in the case of a partnership, means the removal, addition, or substitution of a partner. In the case of a corporation, the term means the merger of the provider corporation into another corporation, or the consolidation of two or more corporations, resulting in the creation of a new corporation. The transfer of corporate stock or the merger of another corporation into the provider corporation does not constitute a change of ownership.
- i. e. If a permitted facility ~~has a~~ will have a change in ownership, name or location, a new updated/amended permit must be obtained issued from the Board. Application for this new permit must be made to the Board at least ten (10) days prior to the change to doing business under the new name or location.
- f. The Board may declare a pharmaceutical facility/business permit inactive due to the lack of legitimate business activity for sixty (60) consecutive days. Any permit declared inactive by the Board must petition the Board to be re-instated.

4. Exemptions.

- a. The permitting requirements of this section do not apply to the following entities or practitioners unless they have a separate business entity, company, corporation or division that is in the business of providing home medical equipment for sale or rent to patients at their places of residence:
 - i. Home health agencies;
 - ii. Hospitals;
 - iii. Wholesalers and/or manufacturers;
 - iv. Medical doctors, physical therapists, respiratory therapists, occupational therapists, speech pathologists, optometrists, chiropractors and podiatrists who use home medical equipment and/or legend devices in their individual practices;
 - v. Pharmacies;
 - vi. Hospice programs;
 - vii. Nursing homes and/or long-term care facilities;
 - viii. Veterinarians; dentists; and emergency medical services.
 - b. Although community pharmacies are exempt from the permitting requirements of this section, they shall be subject to the same regulations that are applicable to permitted businesses or entities for the sale or rental of home medical equipment covered by this section.
 - c. Nothing in this section shall prohibit trained individuals from using oxygen, liquid oxygen and/or legend devices in emergencies.
 - d. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the prehospital emergency administration of oxygen by licensed health care providers, emergency medical technicians, first responders, fire fighters, law enforcement officers and other emergency personnel trained in the proper use of emergency oxygen.

~~Home medical equipment suppliers shall not provide any home medical equipment, legend device or medical gas to a patient without a valid order from an authorized licensed practitioner.~~
All Orders must be readily retrievable and must be produced on request by the Board or an agent of the Board. All home medical equipment, legend devices and medical gases require a new prescription order on a yearly basis.

The regulations shall include, without limitation:~~

- ~~(a) Minimum information from each home medical equipment, legend device and medical gas supplier required for permitting and renewal permits;~~
- ~~(b) Minimum qualifications of persons who engage in the distribution of home medical equipment;~~
- ~~(c) Appropriate education, training or experience of persons employed by home medical equipment suppliers;~~
- ~~(d) Minimum standards for storage of home medical equipment;~~
- ~~(e) Minimum requirements for the establishment and maintenance of all records for the sale, rental and servicing of home medical equipment; and~~

- (f) Minimum standards of operation and professional conduct to include, but not be limited to:
- (i) Employment of qualified personnel to properly render medical equipment services in the manner prescribed by law;

 - (iii) A copy of these regulations shall be present in the facility at all times;

 - (vi) The applicant complies with all USP, FDA, DOT and OSHA requirements regarding the storage, packaging, labeling and shipping of medical equipment including medical gases;
 - (vii) The applicant's services are available twenty-four (24) hours, seven (7) days per week when essential to the maintenance of life or when lack of services might reasonably cause harm;
 - (viii) The applicant implements and maintains a written procedure at each location for handling complaints and problems, which includes a complaint file documenting complaints and problems and resolution of the complaints and problems;
 - (ix) The applicant complies with all local/state fire and building laws; and
 - (x) The facility is equipped with a functioning lavatory where hot and cold running water or hand washing appliances or waterless hand cleaner are available.

6. Policies and programs shall be implemented to include:
- a. Policies that specify minimum standards for personnel qualifications, training, experience, and continuing education requirements consistent with the specialized equipment, items, and services it provides to clients;
 - b. Policies that describe job descriptions, competencies, disciplinary action measures, rules of employment and employee orientation;
 - c. Written procedures at each location for handling employee complaints and problems, which includes a complaint file documenting complaints and problems and resolution of the complaints and problems; and
 - d. Policies shall allow unrestricted access to the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy website and regulations.
7. Minimum standards for competency of employees:
- a. All employees shall be competent to perform the services of the position for which they are hired.
 - b. Assessment of staff competency shall be reviewed/revised/updated at least every two (2) years.
 - c. The competency policy shall outline the competency program including services and tasks performed by each designated staff member based on job function or category. This policy shall be reviewed and signed by each staff member.
 - d. Competency for licensed or certified professionals may only be evaluated by a similarly licensed or certified professional.

8. Minimum standards for education and training of persons employed by home medical equipment suppliers:

- a. Educational topics provided must be relevant to the employee's job function and provided on an annual basis.
- b. Records of staff attendance at all educational programs shall be maintained.
- c. The educational program shall include:
 - i. OSHA and safety issues to include fire safety, disaster preparedness, and office security;
 - ii. HIPAA, privacy, and security;
 - iii. Compliance and Fraud, Waste and Abuse; and
 - iv. Any new products or services the organization plans to provide.
- d. Orientation and training shall be provided to each employee whose job functions require it within sixty (60) days of employment. Orientation and training of the following areas shall be documented:
 - i. Use of the equipment;
 - ii. Safety and cleaning precautions and procedures for equipment;
 - iii. Preventative maintenance, repair, and testing program for equipment;
 - iv. Return demonstrations on back up oxygen systems delivered;
 - v. Emergency and routine contact procedures; and
 - vi. Delivery and review of written instruction materials to the patient to ensure the patient receives adequate information in order to properly operate the equipment.

9. Minimum standards for physical location and storage of home medical equipment:

- a. Suitable facilities shall be maintained to house inventory, to allow for equipment maintenance workspace and the storage and retrieval of all records required to be kept;
- b. The facility is kept in a clean, orderly, and sanitary condition at all times;
- c. The applicant's services are accessible to its customer base;
- d. The applicant complies with all USP, FDA, DOT and OSHA requirements regarding the storage, packaging, labeling, and shipping of medical equipment including medical gases;
- e. The applicant's services are available applicant can be contacted twenty-four (24) hours, seven (7) days per week when services needed are essential to the maintenance of life or when lack of services might reasonably cause harm;
- f. The applicant complies with all local/state fire and building laws;
- g. The facility is equipped with a functioning lavatory where hot and cold running water or hand washing appliances or waterless hand cleaner are available; and
- h. The facility is temperature controlled and regulated as required by the manufacturer.

10. Minimum standards for selection of equipment, devices, and supplies:

- a. All equipment, devices, and supplies shall be based on patient need;
- b. The permit holder shall obtain copies of features, warranties, and instructions for all items from the manufacturers;
- c. All items shall meet applicable Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations.

11. Minimum standards of safety and cleaning requirements:

- (e) Meet the following safety inspection requirements:

- a. ~~(i)~~ Demonstrate and maintain documentation that a function and safety check was performed on each piece of oxygen/respiratory equipment has been checked prior to set up, and such equipment is free of defects and operates within the manufacturer's specifications;
- ~~(ii) Refrain from modifying equipment to the extent that the modification might reasonably cause harm;~~
- ~~(iii) Maintain all electrical components so that they do not present fire or shock hazard; and~~
 - b. ~~(iv)~~ Ensure Document that all appropriate warning labels or labeling, including tags, are present on the equipment provided.

17. The above required policies and documentation shall be in writing and shall be available onsite or immediately accessible electronically, and provided upon the request of an agent of the Board.
18. A permit holder shall report to the Board within thirty (30) days any adverse action taken by another licensing jurisdiction, government agency, law enforcement agency, or court.
19. Failure to comply with the required policies and/or standards set forth in this Article shall be deemed a violation of the rules and regulations of the Board and may result in disciplinary action taken by the Board.

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 73-21-71 THROUGH 73-21-129, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH ARE THE MISSISSIPPI PHARMACY PRACTICE ACT; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION XXXXXXXXXX MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO XXXXXXXXXX; TO AMEND SECTION 73-21-69, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF THE REPEALER ON THE MISSISSIPPI PHARMACY PRACTICE ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

Section 73-21-69. Repeal of Sections 73-21-71 through 73-21-129.

Sections 73-21-71 through Section 73-21-129, which create the State Board of Pharmacy and prescribe its duties and powers, shall stand repealed on July 1, 2029.

Section 73-21-71. Short Title. Reenacted with no change.

This chapter shall be known as the "Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Act."

Section 73-21-73. Definitions Reenacted with amendment.

As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:

(a) "Administer" means the direct application of a prescription drug pursuant to a lawful order of a practitioner to the body of a patient by injection, inhalation, ingestion or any other means.

(b) "Biological product" means the same as that term is defined in 42 USC Section 262.

(c) "Board of Pharmacy," "Pharmacy Board," "MSBP" or "board" means the State Board of Pharmacy.

(d) "Compounding" means (i) the production, preparation, propagation, conversion or processing of a sterile or nonsterile drug or device either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of natural origin or independently by means of chemical or biological synthesis or from bulk chemicals or the preparation, mixing, measuring, assembling, packaging or labeling of a drug or device as a result of a practitioner's prescription drug order or initiative based on the practitioner/patient/pharmacist relationship in the course of professional practice, or (ii) for the purpose of, as an incident to, research, teaching or chemical analysis and not for sale or dispensing. Compounding also includes the preparation of drugs or devices in anticipation of prescription drug orders based on routine regularly observed prescribing patterns.

(e) "Continuing education unit" means ten (10) clock hours of study or other such activity as may be approved by the board, including, but not limited to, all programs which have been approved by the ~~American Council on Pharmaceutical~~ Accreditation Council on Pharmacy Education.

(f) "Deliver" or "delivery" means the actual, constructive or attempted transfer in any manner of a drug or device from one (1) person to another, whether or not for a consideration, including, but not limited to, delivery by mailing or shipping.

(g) "Device" means an instrument, apparatus, implement, machine, contrivance, implant, in vitro reagent or other similar or related article, including any component part or accessory which is required under federal or state law to be prescribed by a practitioner ~~and dispensed by a pharmacist.~~

(h) "Dispense" or "dispensing" means the interpretation of a valid prescription of a practitioner by a pharmacist and the subsequent preparation of the drug or device for administration to or use by a patient or other individual entitled to receive the drug and includes delivery of the drug or device to the patient.

(i) "Distribute" means the delivery of a drug or device other than by administering or dispensing to persons other than the ultimate consumer.

(j) "Drug" means:

(i) Articles recognized as drugs in the official United States Pharmacopeia, official National Formulary, official Homeopathic Pharmacopeia, other drug compendium or any supplement to any of them;

(ii) Articles intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in man or other animals;

(iii) Articles other than food intended to affect the structure or any function of the body of man or other animals; and

(iv) Articles intended for use as a component of any articles specified in subparagraph (i), (ii) or (iii) of this paragraph.

~~(k) "Drugroom" means a business, which does not require the services of a pharmacist, where prescription drugs or prescription devices are bought, sold, maintained or provided to consumers.~~

~~(l)~~ (k) "Extern" means a student in the professional program of a school of pharmacy accredited by the ~~American Council on Pharmaceutical~~ Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education who is making normal progress toward completion of a professional degree in pharmacy.

~~(m)~~ (l) "Foreign pharmacy graduate" means a person whose undergraduate pharmacy degree was conferred by a recognized school of pharmacy outside of the United States, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. ~~(o)~~ (n) "Interchangeable biological product" or "I.B." means a biological product that the federal Food and Drug Administration:

(i) Has licensed and determined as meeting the standards for interchangeability under 42 USC Section 262(k)(4); or

(ii) Has determined is therapeutically equivalent as set forth in the latest edition of or supplement to the federal Food and Drug Administration's Approved Drug Products with Therapeutic Equivalence Evaluations.

~~(p)~~ "Internet" means collectively the myriad of computer and telecommunications facilities, including equipment and operating software, which comprise the interconnected worldwide network of networks that employ the Transmission Control Protocol/Internet Protocol, or any predecessor or successor protocol to such protocol, to communicate information of all kinds by wire or radio.

~~(q)~~ "Interested directly" means being employed by, having full or partial ownership of, or control of, any facility permitted or licensed by the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy.

~~(r)~~ "Interested indirectly" means having a spouse who is employed by any facility permitted or licensed by the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy.

~~(s o)~~ "Intern" means a person who has graduated from a school of pharmacy but has not yet become licensed as a pharmacist.

~~(t p)~~ "Manufacturer" means a person, business or other entity engaged in the production, preparation, propagation, conversion, or processing of a prescription drug or device, if such actions are associated with promotion and marketing of such drugs or devices.

(H jj) "Written guideline or protocol" means an agreement in which any practitioner authorized to prescribe drugs delegates to a pharmacist authority to conduct specific prescribing functions in an institutional setting, or with the practitioner's individual patients, provided that a specific protocol agreement between the practitioner and the pharmacist is signed and filed as required by law or by rule or regulation of the board.

(mm) "Pharmacy services administrative organization" means any entity that contracts with a pharmacy or pharmacist to assist with third-party payer interactions and that may provide a variety of other administrative services, including but not limited to contracting with pharmacy benefits managers on behalf of pharmacies and providing pharmacies with credentialing, billing, audit, general business, and analytic support.

Section 73-21-75. State Board of Pharmacy; number, qualifications, appointment and terms of members; appointments made from names submitted by pharmacist associations; filling of vacancies; removal of members. Reenacted with no change.

(1) The State Board of Pharmacy created by former Section 73-21-9 is continued and reconstituted as follows: The board shall consist of seven (7) appointed members. At least one (1) appointment shall be made from each congressional district. Each appointed member of the board shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, from a list of five (5) names submitted by the Mississippi Pharmacists Association, with input from the Magnolia Pharmaceutical Society, the Mississippi Independent Pharmacies Association (MIPA), Mississippi Society of Health-System Pharmacists (MSHP) and Mississippi College of Clinical Pharmacy (MCCP) and other pharmacist associations or societies. Of the members appointed, one (1) shall, at the time of appointment, have had five (5) years' experience as a pharmacist at a facility holding an institutional permit, and one (1) shall, at the time of appointment, have had five (5) years' experience as a pharmacist at a facility holding a retail permit. Any person appointed to the board shall be limited to two (2) full terms of office during any fifteen-year period, including any member serving on May 14, 1992.

(2) The members of the board appointed and serving prior to July 1, 1983, whose terms have not expired by July 1, 1983, shall serve the balance of their terms as members of the reconstituted board, and they shall be considered to be from the same congressional districts from which they were originally appointed if they still reside therein, even if the district boundaries have changed subsequent to their original appointments. The Governor shall appoint the remaining members of the reconstituted board in the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section on July 1, 1983. The initial members of the reconstituted board shall serve terms of office as follows:

(a) The term of the member from the First Congressional District shall expire on July 1, 1984; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 1.

(b) The term of the member from the Second Congressional District shall expire on July 1, 1988; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 2.

(c) The term of the member from the Third Congressional District shall expire on July 1, 1986; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 3.

(d) The term of the member from the Fourth Congressional District shall expire on July 1, 1985; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 4.

(e) The term of the member from the Fifth Congressional District shall expire on July 1, 1987; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 5.

(f) The term of one (1) of the members from the state at large shall expire on July 1, 1985; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 6.

(g) The term of the other member from the state at large shall expire on July 1, 1988; and from and after July 1, 1996, this appointment shall be designated as Post 7.

The appointments of members from congressional districts as provided under this section shall be made from the congressional districts as they existed on July 1, 2001.

(3) At the expiration of a term, members of the board shall be appointed in the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section for terms of five (5) years from the expiration date of the previous terms. Any vacancy on the board prior to the expiration of a term for any reason, including resignation, removal, disqualification, death or disability, shall be filled by appointment of the Governor in the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section for the balance of the unexpired term. The Mississippi Pharmacists Association, with input from the Magnolia Pharmaceutical Society, the Mississippi Independent Pharmacies Association (MIPA), Mississippi Society of Health-System Pharmacists (MSHP) and Mississippi College of Clinical Pharmacy (MCCP) and other pharmacist associations or societies, shall submit a list of nominees no more than thirty (30) days after a vacancy occurs, and the Governor shall fill such vacancies within ninety (90) days after each such vacancy occurs. If an election is required to narrow the number of potential candidates for nominations to the board, the Mississippi Pharmacists Association shall provide a ballot to each pharmacist holding a valid Mississippi license.

(4) To be qualified to be a member of the board, a person shall:

(a) Be an adult citizen of Mississippi for a period of at least five (5) years preceding his appointment to the board;

(b) Be a pharmacist licensed and in good standing to practice pharmacy in the State of Mississippi; and

(c) Have actively engaged in the practice of pharmacy in Mississippi for a period of at least five (5) years.

(5) The Governor may remove any or all members of the board on proof of unprofessional conduct, continued absence from the state, or for failure to perform the duties of his office. Any member who shall not attend two (2) consecutive meetings of the board for any reason other than illness of such member shall be subject to removal by the Governor. The president of the board shall notify the Governor in writing when any such member has failed to attend two (2) consecutive regular meetings. No removal shall be made without first giving the accused an opportunity to be heard in refutation of the charges made against him, and he shall be entitled to receive a copy of the charges at the time of filing.

Section 73-21-77. Organization of board; oath; meetings; compensation and expenses of members. Reenacted with no change.

(1) Each person appointed as a member of the board shall qualify by taking the oath prescribed by the Constitution for the state officers, and shall file certificate thereof in the Office of the Secretary of State within fifteen (15) days after his appointment.

(2) There shall be a president of the board and such other officers as deemed necessary by the board elected by and from its membership.

(3) The board shall meet at least once each quarter to transact business, and may meet at such additional times as it may deem necessary. Such additional meetings may be called by the president of the board or a majority of the members of the board.

(4) The place for each meeting shall be determined prior to giving notice of such meeting and shall not be changed after such notice is given without adequate subsequent notice.

(5) A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of the meeting and all actions of the board shall be by a majority.

(6) Each member of the board shall receive a per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69, not to exceed thirty (30) days in any one (1) period of twelve (12) months, for each day actually engaged in meetings of the board, together with necessary traveling and other expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41.

Section 73-21-79. Executive director; additional employees; legal counsel. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) The board shall employ an executive director of the board. The executive director shall be a citizen of Mississippi and a pharmacist licensed and in good standing to practice pharmacy in the State of Mississippi, who has had five (5) years' experience as a pharmacist.

(2) The executive director shall receive a salary to be set by the board, subject to the approval of the State Personnel Board, and shall be entitled to necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties. He shall devote full time to the duties of his office and shall not be engaged in any other business that will interfere with the duties of his office.

(3) The duties and responsibilities of the executive director shall be ~~defined by rules and regulations~~ prescribed by the board. The board, in its discretion, may delegate to the executive director such powers and duties as it deems appropriate. Additionally, the executive director may, with the approval of the board, delegate to any officer or employee of the board such of his powers and duties as he finds necessary to effectuate the purposed of this chapter.

(4) The board may, in its discretion, employ persons in addition to the executive director in such other positions or capacities as it deems necessary to the proper conduct of board business. Any pharmacist-investigator employed by the board may have other part-time employment, provided that he shall not accept any employment that would cause a conflict of interest in his pharmacist-investigator duties. The board may employ legal counsel to assist in the conduct of its business.

Section 73-21-81. General powers and duties of board; enforcement of chapter; rules and regulations. Reenacted with no change.

The responsibility for the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter shall be vested in the board. The board shall have all of the duties, powers and authority specifically granted by and necessary to the enforcement of this chapter. The board may make, adopt, amend and repeal such rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary by the board, from time to time, for the

proper administration and enforcement of this chapter, in accordance with the provisions of the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law (Section 25-43-1.101 et seq.).

Section 73-21-83. Regulation of pharmaceutical practice. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) The board shall be responsible for the control and regulation of the practice of pharmacy, to include the regulation of pharmacists, pharmacy externs or interns and pharmacist technicians, in this state, the regulation of the manufacturing and wholesaler distribution of drugs and devices as defined in Section 73-21-73, the distribution of sample drugs or devices by manufacturer's distributors as defined in Section 73-21-73 by persons other than the original manufacturer or distributor in this state and the regulation of pharmacy benefit managers as defined in Section 73-21-153 and pharmacy services administrative organizations as defined in Section 73-21-73.

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(2) A license for the practice of pharmacy shall be obtained by all persons prior to their engaging in the practice of pharmacy. However, the provisions of this chapter shall not apply to ~~physicians, dentists, veterinarians, osteopaths or other practitioners of the healing arts~~ who are licensed under the laws of the State of Mississippi and are authorized to dispense and administer prescription drugs in the course of their professional practice.

(3) The initial licensure fee shall be set by the board but shall not exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), except the initial licensure fee for pharmacy benefit managers and pharmacy services administrative organizations shall be set by the board but shall not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

(4) All students actively enrolled in a professional school of pharmacy accredited by the ~~American Council on Pharmaceutical Education~~ Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education who are making satisfactory progress toward graduation and who act as an extern or intern under the direct supervision of a pharmacist in a location permitted by the Board of Pharmacy must obtain a pharmacy student registration prior to engaging in such activity. The student registration fee shall be set by the board but shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

(5) All persons licensed to practice pharmacy prior to July 1, 1991, by the State Board of Pharmacy under Section 73-21-89 shall continue to be licensed under the provisions of Section 73-21-91.

Section 73-21-85. Requirements for pharmacist's license by examination or score transfer; licensing of foreign pharmacy graduates; criminal background checks. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) To obtain a license to engage in the practice of pharmacy by examination, or by score transfer, the applicant shall:

- (a) Have submitted a written application on the form prescribed by the board;
- (b) Be of good moral character;
- (c) Have graduated from a school or college of pharmacy accredited by the American Council of Pharmaceutical Education and have been granted a pharmacy degree therefrom;
- (d) Have successfully passed an examination approved by the board;
- (e) Have paid all fees specified by the board for examination, not to exceed the cost to the board of administering the examination;
- (f) Have paid all fees specified by the board for licensure; and

(g) Have submitted evidence of externship and/or internship as specified by the board.

(2) To obtain a license to engage in the practice of pharmacy, a foreign pharmacy graduate applicant shall obtain the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Committee's certification, which shall include, but not be limited to, successfully passing the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination and attaining a total score of at least five hundred fifty (550) on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), and shall:

- (a) Have submitted a written application on the form prescribed by the board;
- (b) Be of good moral character;
- (c) Have graduated and been granted a pharmacy degree from a college or school of pharmacy recognized and approved by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Committee;
- (d) Have paid all fees specified by the board for examination, not to exceed the cost to the board of administering the examination;
- (e) Have successfully passed an examination approved by the board;
- (f) Have completed the number of internship hours as set forth by regulations of the board; and
- (g) Have paid all fees specified by the board for licensure.

(3) Each application or filing made under this section shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in accordance with Section 93-11-64.

(4) To insure that all applicants are of good moral character, the board shall conduct a criminal history records check on all applicants for a license. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for licensing, the applicant shall be fingerprinted. The board shall submit the fingerprints to the Department of Public Safety for a check of the state criminal records and forward to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a check of the national criminal records. The Department of Public Safety shall disseminate the results of the state check and the national check to the board for a suitability determination. The board shall be authorized to collect from the applicant the amount of the fee that the Department of Public Safety charges the board for the fingerprinting, whether manual or electronic, and the state and national criminal history records checks.

(5) To insure that all applicants are of good moral character, the board, upon request of the ~~Dean of the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy~~, dean of a school of pharmacy in Mississippi, shall be authorized to conduct a criminal history records check on all applicants for enrollment into the School of Pharmacy. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for enrollment and licensing, the applicant shall be fingerprinted. The board shall submit the fingerprints to the Department of Public Safety for a check of the state criminal records and forward to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a check of the national criminal records. The Department of Public Safety shall disseminate the results of the state check and the national check to the board for a suitability determination and the board shall forward the results to the Dean of the School of Pharmacy. The board shall be authorized to collect from the applicant the amount of the fee that the Department of Public Safety charges the board for the fingerprinting, whether manual or electronic, and the state and national criminal history records checks.

Section 73-21-87. Requirements for pharmacist's license by reciprocity or license transfer. Reenacted with no change.

(1) To obtain a license to engage in the practice of pharmacy by reciprocity or license transfer, the applicant shall:

- (a) Have submitted a written application on the form prescribed by the board;
- (b) Be of good moral character;
- (c) Have possessed at the time of initial licensure as a pharmacist such other qualifications necessary to have been eligible for licensure at that time in that state;
- (d) Have presented to the board proof that any license or licenses granted to the applicant by any other states have not been suspended, revoked, cancelled or otherwise restricted for any reason except nonrenewal or the failure to obtain required continuing education credits; and
- (e) Have paid all fees specified by the board for licensure.

(2) No applicant shall be eligible for licensure by reciprocity or license transfer unless the state in which the applicant was initially licensed also grants a reciprocal license or transfer license to pharmacists licensed by this state under like circumstances and conditions.

(3) The issuance of a license by reciprocity to a military-trained applicant, military spouse or person who establishes residence in this state shall be subject to the provisions of Section 73-50-1 or 73-50-2, as applicable.

(4) Each application or filing made under this section shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in accordance with Section 93-11-64.

Section 73-21-89 Requirements for pharmacist's license for graduates of University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy; termination of provisions. Repeal.

~~(1) The board shall issue a license to practice pharmacy to any person, if such person be otherwise qualified, upon presentation to the board of:~~

- ~~(a) Satisfactory proof that the applicant has been graduated from the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy;~~
- ~~(b) Written application for licensure; and~~
- ~~(c) Payment of all fees specified by the board for licensure.~~

~~(2) The board shall not issue any new licenses pursuant to this section after June 30, 1987.~~

~~(3) Each application or filing made under this section shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.~~

Section 73-21-91. Renewal of licenses; reinstatement upon failure to renew. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) Every pharmacist shall renew his license annually. To renew his license, a pharmacist shall:

- (a) Submit an application for renewal on the form prescribed by the board;
- (b) Submit satisfactory evidence of the completion ~~in the last licensure period~~ of such continuing education units as shall be required by the board, but in no case less than one (1) continuing education unit in the last licensure period;

(c)(i) Pay any renewal fees as required by the board, not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each annual licensing period, provided that the board may add a surcharge of not more than ~~Five Ten~~ Dollars (\$~~5~~ 10.00) to a license renewal fee to fund a program to aid impaired pharmacists or pharmacy students. Any pharmacist license renewal received postmarked after December 31 of the renewal period will be returned and a Fifty Dollar (\$50.00) late renewal fee will be assessed before renewal.

(ii) The renewal license fee for a pharmacy benefit manager or a pharmacy services administrative organization shall be set by the board, but shall not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Any license renewal received postmarked after December 31 of the renewal period will be returned and a Five Hundred Dollar (\$500.00) late renewal fee will be assessed before renewal.

(2) Any pharmacist who has defaulted in license renewal may be reinstated within two (2) years upon payment of renewal fees in arrears and presentation of evidence of the required continuing education. Any pharmacist defaulting in license renewal for a period in excess of two (2) years shall be required to successfully complete the examination ~~given~~ approved by the board pursuant to Section 73-21-85 before being eligible for reinstatement as a pharmacist in Mississippi, or shall be required to appear before the board to be examined for his competence and knowledge of the practice of pharmacy, and may be required to submit evidence of continuing education. If the person is found fit by the board to practice pharmacy in this state, the board may reinstate his license to practice pharmacy upon payment of all renewal fees in arrears.

(3) Each application or filing made under this section shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in accordance with Section 93-11-64.

Section 73-21-93. Examination; frequency and location; scope; facilities. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) The examination for licensure required under Section 73-21-85 shall be given ~~by the board~~ at least once during each year. The board shall determine the content and subject matter of each examination, the place, time and date of the administration of the examination and those persons who have successfully passed the examination.

(2) The examination shall be prepared to measure the competence of the applicant to engage in the practice of pharmacy. The board may employ and cooperate with any organization or consultant in the preparation and grading of an appropriate examination, but shall retain the sole discretion and responsibility of determining which applicants have successfully passed such an examination.

~~(3) The board shall have authority to use the laboratories of the school of pharmacy and other facilities of the University of Mississippi for the purpose of examining applicants.~~

Section 73-21-95. Abolition of assistant pharmacist's license; issuance of pharmacists' licenses to persons holding such licenses. Repealed

The assistant pharmacist license is hereby abolished after April 30, 1984. The board shall issue a license to practice pharmacy to those persons presently holding an assistant pharmacist license upon their meeting the requirements of Section 73-21-91.

Section 73-21-97. Denial of renewal, suspension, revocation or restrictions on licenses, registrations or permits; grounds; warning or reprimand. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) The board may refuse to issue or renew, or may suspend, reprimand, revoke or restrict the license, registration or permit of any person or may impose a monetary penalty upon one or more of the following grounds:

- (a) Unprofessional conduct as defined by the rules and regulations of the board;
- (b) Incapacity of a nature that prevents a pharmacist; or intern/extern from engaging in the practice of pharmacy or a pharmacy technician from engaging in or providing nonjudgmental technical services in the practice of pharmacy with reasonable skill, confidence and safety to the public;
- (c) Being found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of one or more of the following:
 - (i) A felony;
 - (ii) Any act involving moral turpitude or gross immorality; or
 - (iii) Violation of pharmacy or drug laws of this state or rules or regulations pertaining thereto, or of statutes, rules or regulations of any other state or the federal government;
- (d) Fraud or intentional misrepresentation by a licensee, registrant or permit holder in securing the issuance or renewal of a license or permit;
- (e) Engaging or aiding and abetting an individual to engage in the practice of pharmacy without a license;
- (f) Violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or rules or regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter;
- (g) Failure to comply with lawful orders of the board;
- (h) Negligently or willfully acting in a manner inconsistent with the health or safety of the public;
- (i) Addiction to or dependence on alcohol or controlled substances or the unauthorized use or possession of controlled substances;
- (j) Misappropriation of any prescription drug;
- (k) Being found guilty by the licensing agency in another state of violating the statutes, rules or regulations of that jurisdiction;
- (l) The unlawful or unauthorized possession of a controlled substance;
- (m) Willful failure to submit drug monitoring information or willful submission of incorrect dispensing information as required by the Prescription Monitoring Program under Section 73-21-127;
- (n) Failure to obtain the license, registration or permit required by this chapter; or
- (o) Violation(s) of the provisions of Sections 41-121-1 through 41-121-9 relating to deceptive advertisement by health care practitioners. This paragraph shall stand repealed on July 1, 2025.

(2) In lieu of suspension, revocation or restriction of a license, registration or permit as provided for above, the board may warn ~~or~~, reprimand or issue a citation to the offending ~~pharmacist~~ licensee, registrant or permit holder.

(3) In addition to the grounds specified in subsection (1) of this section, the board shall be authorized to suspend the license, registration or permit of any person for being out of compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 93-11-153. The procedure for

suspension of a license, registration or permit for being out of compliance with an order for support, and the procedure for the reissuance or reinstatement of a license, registration or permit suspended for that purpose, and the payment of any fees for the reissuance or reinstatement of a license, registration or permit suspended for that purpose, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be. If there is any conflict between any provision of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 and any provision of this chapter, the provisions of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be, shall control.

Section 73-21-99. Hearings on violations; notice; procedure. Reenacted with amendment.

(1) Disciplinary action by the board against a licensee, registrant or permit holder, or license, registration or permit shall require the following:

(a) A sworn affidavit filed with the board charging a licensee, registrant or permit holder with an act which is grounds for disciplinary action as provided in Section 73-21-97; and

(b) An order of the Investigations Review Committee of the board which shall cause the executive director of the board to fix a time and place for a hearing by the board. The executive director shall cause a written notice specifying the offense or offenses for which the licensee, registrant or permit holder is charged and notice of the time and place of the hearing to be served upon the licensee, registrant or permit holder at least thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date. Such notice may be served by mailing a copy thereof by certified mail, postage prepaid, to the last-known residence or business address of the licensee or permit holder.

(2) The board shall designate two (2) of its members to serve on a rotating, no longer than three-consecutive-month basis, with the executive director and legal counsel serving in an advisory role, for the board as an Investigations Review Committee, and the board's investigators shall provide status reports solely to the Investigations Review Committee during monthly meetings of the board Investigations Review Committee. Such reports shall be made on all ongoing investigations, and shall apply to any routine inspections which may give rise to the filing of a complaint. In the event any complaint on a licensee, registrant or permit holder comes before the board for possible disciplinary action, the members of the board serving on the Investigations Review Committee which reviewed the investigation of such complaint shall recuse themselves and not participate in the disciplinary proceeding. All meetings of the Investigations Review Committee shall be exempt from the Open Meetings Act and minutes of the meetings of the Investigations Review Committee shall be exempt from the Public Records Act.

(3) ~~The board acting by and through its Investigation Review Committee~~ may, if deemed necessary, issue a letter of reprimand to any licensee, registrant or permit holder in lieu of formal action by the board.

(4) For the purpose of conducting investigations, the board, through its executive director, may issue subpoenas to any individual, clinic, hospital, pharmacy, any other facility permitted by the board, or other entity having in its possession papers, documents, prescriptions or any other records deemed relevant to an investigation. Investigatory subpoenas, as provided in this section, may be served either by registered mail or by any person designated by the board for such service, and upon service shall command production of the papers and documents to the board at the time and place so specified. The board shall be entitled to the assistance of the chancery court or the chancellor in vacation, which, on petition by the board, shall issue ancillary subpoenas and

petitions and may punish as for contempt of court in the event of noncompliance with the subpoenas or petitions.

(5) All records of investigation, including complaints filed with the board, shall be kept confidential and shall not be subject to discovery or subpoena. If no disciplinary proceedings are initiated within a period of five (5) years after the determination of insufficient cause, then the board may destroy all records obtained pursuant to this section.

(64) The board, acting by and through its executive director, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses and the production of books and papers at such hearing. Process Subpoenas, as provided in this section, issued by the board, through its executive director shall extend to all parts of the state and shall be served by registered mail or by any person designated by the board for such service.

(75) The accused shall have the right to appear either personally or by counsel, or both, to produce witnesses or evidence in his behalf, to cross-examine witnesses, and to have subpoenas issued by the board.

(86) At the hearing, the board shall administer oaths as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the hearing. All hearings shall be conducted by the board, which shall not be bound by strict rules of procedure or by the laws of evidence in the conduct of its proceedings, but the determination shall be based upon sufficient evidence to sustain it.

(97) Where, in any proceeding before the board, any witness fails or refuses to attend upon a subpoena issued by the board, refuses to testify, or refuses to produce any books and papers the production of which is called for by a subpoena, the attendance of such witness, the giving of his testimony or the production of the books and papers shall be enforced by any court of competent jurisdiction of this state in the manner provided for the enforcement of attendance and testimony of witnesses in civil cases in the courts of this state.

(108) The board shall, within thirty (30) days after conclusion of the hearing, reduce its decision to writing and forward an attested true copy thereof to the last-known residence or business address of such licensee or permit holder by way of United States first-class, certified mail, postage prepaid.

(11) If the board determines that evidence in its possession indicates that there is an immediate danger to the public, the board, acting by and through its executive director, may order summary suspension of an individual's license or registration or a permit of a facility without a hearing simultaneously with the filing of a formal complaint and notice for a hearing proceeding before the board. Provided that in the event of such summary suspension, a hearing must be held within twenty (20) days of such action.

Section 73-21-101. Appeal from adverse action on a license, registration or permit; scope of review. Reenact with amendment.

(1) The right to appeal from the action of the board in denying, revoking, suspending or refusing to renew any license, registration or permit issued by the board, or fining or otherwise disciplining any person is hereby granted. Such appeal shall be to the chancery court of the county of the residence of the licensee or permit holder on the record made, including a verbatim transcript of the testimony at the hearing. The appeal shall be taken within thirty (30) days after notice of the action of the board in denying, revoking, suspending or refusing to renew the license or permit, or fining or otherwise disciplining the person. The appeal shall be perfected upon filing notice of the appeal and by the prepayment of all costs, including the cost of the

preparation of the record of the proceedings by the board, and the filing of a bond in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), conditioned that if the action of the board in denying, revoking, suspending or refusing to renew the license or permit, or fining or otherwise disciplining the person, be affirmed by the chancery court, the licensee or permit holder will pay the costs of the appeal and the action in the chancery court.

(2) If there is an appeal, such appeal shall act as a supersedeas as to any monetary penalty imposed by the board, however, no such person shall be allowed to practice pharmacy or conduct any activities regulated pursuant to this Chapter in violation of any disciplinary order or action of the board while any such appeal is pending. The chancery court shall dispose of the appeal and enter its decision promptly. The hearing on the appeal may, in the discretion of the chancellor, be tried in vacation. The scope of review of the chancery court shall be limited to a review of the record made before the board to determine if the action of the board is unlawful for the reason that it was (a) not supported by substantial evidence, (b) arbitrary or capricious, (c) beyond the power of the board to make, or (d) in violation of some statutory or constitutional right of the appellant. The decision of the chancery court may be appealed to the Supreme Court in the manner provided by law.

(3) Actions taken by the board in suspending a license, registration or permit when required by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 are not actions from which an appeal may be taken under this section. Any appeal of a suspension of a license, registration or permit that is required by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 shall be taken in accordance with the appeal procedure specified in Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be, rather than the procedure specified in this section.

Section 73-21-103. Penalties for violations; requirement of rehabilitation or additional education; reinstatement of licenses or permits; enforcement proceedings. Reenact with amendment.

(1) Upon the finding of the existence of grounds for action against any permitted facility or discipline of any person holding a license, registration or permit, seeking a license, registration or permit, seeking to renew a license or permit under the provisions of this chapter, or practicing or doing business without a license, registration or permit, the board may impose one or more of the following penalties:

(a) Suspension of the offender's license, registration and/or permit for a term to be determined by the board;

(b) Revocation of the offender's license, registration and/or permit;

(c) Restriction of the offender's license, registration and/or permit to prohibit the offender from performing certain acts or from engaging in the practice of pharmacy in a particular manner for a term to be determined by the board;

(d) Imposition of a monetary penalty as follows:

(i) For the first violation, a monetary penalty of not ~~less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)~~ nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation;

(ii) For the second violation and subsequent violations, a monetary penalty of not ~~less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)~~ nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each violation.

Money collected by the board under paragraph (d)(i), (ii) and (iv) of this section shall be deposited to the credit of the State General Fund of the State Treasury;

(iii) The board may assess a monetary penalty for those reasonable costs that are expended by the board in the investigation and conduct of a proceeding for licensure revocation, suspension or restriction, including, but not limited to, the cost of process service, court reporters, expert witnesses and investigators.

Money collected by the board under paragraph (d)(iii) of this section, shall be deposited to the credit of the Special Fund of the Pharmacy Board;

(iv) The board may impose a monetary penalty for those facilities/businesses registered with the Pharmacy Board ~~as wholesalers/manufacturers of not less than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per violation and not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per violation.~~

(v) The board may impose a monetary penalty for any dispenser, pharmacist or practitioner licensed to dispense controlled substance and specified noncontrolled substance drugs, who knowingly fails to submit drug monitoring information or knowingly submits incorrect dispensing information of not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per violation. Any penalty collected under this paragraph (v) shall be deposited into the special fund of the State Pharmacy Board to support the operations of the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP);

(vi) The board may impose a monetary penalty for any person who obtains prescription information and who knowingly discloses this information for misuse or purposely alters the reporting information, or uses the PMP in any manner other than for which it was intended, of not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per violation. Any penalty collected under this paragraph (vi) shall be deposited into the special fund of the State Board of Pharmacy and used to support the operations of the Prescription Monitoring Program;

(vii) The board may impose a monetary penalty of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per day upon any person or business that practices or does business without the license, registration or permit required by this chapter. The violation may be assessed beginning with the date the offender first conducted business in the state.

(e) Refusal to renew offender's license, registration and/or permit;

(f) Placement of the offender on probation and supervision by the board for a period to be determined by the board;

(g) Public or private reprimand.

Whenever the board imposes any penalty under this subsection, the board may require rehabilitation and/or additional education as the board may deem proper under the circumstances, in addition to the penalty imposed.

(2) Any person whose license, registration and/or permit has been suspended, revoked or restricted pursuant to this chapter, whether voluntarily or by action of the board, shall have the right to petition the board at reasonable intervals for reinstatement of such license, registration and/or permit. Such petition shall be made in writing and in the form prescribed by the board. Upon investigation and hearing, the board may, in its discretion, grant or deny such petition, or it may modify its original finding to reflect any circumstances which have changed sufficiently to warrant such modifications. The procedure for the reinstatement of a license, registration or permit that is suspended for being out of compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 93-11-153, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be.

(3) Nothing herein shall be construed as barring criminal prosecutions for violation of this chapter where such violations are deemed as criminal offenses in other statutes of this state or of the United States.

(4) A monetary penalty assessed and levied under this section shall be paid to the board by the licensee, registrant or permit holder upon the expiration of the period allowed for appeal of such penalties under Section 73-21-101, or may be paid sooner if the licensee, registrant or permit holder elects.

(5) When payment of a monetary penalty assessed and levied by the board against a licensee, registrant or permit holder in accordance with this section is not paid by the licensee, registrant or permit holder when due under this section, the board shall have the power to institute and maintain proceedings in its name for enforcement of payment in the chancery court of the county and judicial district of residence of the licensee, registrant or permit holder, or if the licensee, registrant or permit holder is a nonresident of the State of Mississippi, in the Chancery Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi. When such proceedings are instituted, the board shall certify the record of its proceedings, together with all documents and evidence, to the chancery court and the matter shall thereupon be heard in due course by the court, which shall review the record and make its determination thereon. The hearing on the matter may, in the discretion of the chancellor, be tried in vacation.

(6) The board shall develop and implement a uniform penalty policy which shall set the minimum and maximum penalty for any given violation of board regulations and laws governing the practice of pharmacy. The board shall adhere to its uniform penalty policy except in such cases where the board specifically finds, by majority vote, that a penalty in excess of, or less than, the uniform penalty is appropriate. Such vote shall be reflected in the minutes of the board and shall not be imposed unless such appears as having been adopted by the board.

Section 73-21-105. Registration of businesses where prescription drugs or devices are dispensed, sold, repackaged, manufactured, etc.; registration of reverse distributors; establishment of criteria; procedures and fees; applications; standards for operation; reports of changes of circumstances; penalties for violations; exemption of physicians, dentists, etc., from chapter. Reenact with amendment.

(1) Every manufacturer, manufacturer affiliate, packager, repackager, third party logistic provider, wholesale distributor, reverse distributor or any other entity identified in the supply chain facility/business that engages in the wholesale of prescription drugs and/or devices that are sold or shipped into or out of this state to include without limitation, manufacturing in this state, distribution into this state, or selling or offering to sell in this state, or distribution from or within this state, and every reverse distributor located in or outside of this state that conducts business with pharmacies in this state, shall register biennially or annually, at least every three (3) years, to be determined by the board, with the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy by applying for a permit on a form supplied by the board and accompanied by a fee as set by subsection (4) of this section. The Pharmacy Board shall by regulation determine the classification of permit(s) that shall be required.

(2) Every business/facility/pharmacy located in this state that engages in or proposes to engage in the dispensing and delivery of prescription drugs practice of pharmacy to consumers shall register with the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy by applying for a permit on a form supplied by the board and accompanied by a fee as set by subsection (4) of this section. The

Pharmacy Board shall by regulation determine the classification of permit(s) that shall be required.

(3) The board shall establish by rule or regulation the criteria which each business shall meet to qualify for a permit in each classification. The board shall issue a permit to any applicant who meets the criteria as established. The board may issue various types of permits with varying restrictions to businesses where the board deems it necessary by reason of the type of activities conducted by the business requesting a permit.

(4) The board shall specify by rule or regulation the registration procedures to be followed, including, but not limited to, specification of forms for use in applying for such permits and times, places and fees for filing such applications. However, permits may be issued up to a triennial period ~~the biennial fee~~ for an original or renewal permit ~~shall~~ with a fee not exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,0500.00).

(5) Applications for permits shall include the following information about the proposed business:

(a) Ownership;

(b) Location;

(c) Identity of the responsible person or pharmacist licensed to practice in the state, who shall be the pharmacist in charge of the pharmacy, where one is required by this chapter, and such further information as the board may deem necessary.

(6) Permits issued by the board pursuant to this section shall not be transferable or assignable.

(7) The board shall specify by rule or regulation minimum standards for the responsibility in the conduct of any business/facility and/or pharmacy that has been issued a permit. The board is specifically authorized to require that the portion of the facility located in this state to which a pharmacy permit applies be operated only under the direct supervision of no less than one (1) pharmacist licensed to practice in this state, and to provide such other special requirements as deemed necessary. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent any person from owning a pharmacy.

(8) All businesses permitted by the board shall report to the board the occurrence of any of the following changes:

(a) Permanent closing;

(b) Change of ownership, management, location or pharmacist in charge;

(c) Any and all other matters and occurrences as the board may require by rule or regulation.

(9) Disasters, accidents and emergencies which may affect the strength, purity or labeling of drugs, medications, devices or other materials used in the diagnosis or the treatment of injury, illness and disease shall be immediately reported to the board.

(10) No business that is required to obtain a permit shall be operated until a permit has been issued for such business by the board. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. However, the provisions of this chapter shall not apply to ~~physicians, dentists, veterinarians, osteopaths or other practitioners of the healing arts~~ practitioners who are licensed under the laws of the State of Mississippi and are

authorized to dispense and administer prescription drugs in the course of their professional practice.

Section 73-21-106. Registration requirement for nonresident pharmacies that ship, mail, or deliver drugs into state or engage in the practice of pharmacy to consumers in this state.
Reenact with amendment.

(1) Any pharmacy located outside this state that ~~ships, mails or delivers, in any manner, controlled substances or prescription or legend drugs or devices into~~ performs any services included in the definition of the practice of pharmacy for residents of this state shall be considered a nonresident pharmacy and shall be permitted by the board. The board shall establish by rule or regulation the criteria that each nonresident pharmacy must meet to qualify for a nonresident permit. After a permit has been issued, it may not be amended, transferred or reassigned. A pharmacist-in-charge of a nonresident pharmacy may not be the pharmacist-in-charge at any other location that has been issued a permit by the board.

(2) Each nonresident pharmacy shall:

(a) Comply with all lawful directions and requests for information from the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which it is licensed as well as with all requests for information made by the board under this section. The nonresident pharmacy shall maintain at all times a valid unexpired license, permit or registration to conduct the pharmacy in compliance with the laws of the state in which it is a resident. As a prerequisite to being permitted by the board, the nonresident pharmacy shall submit a copy of the most recent inspection report resulting from an inspection conducted by the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which it is located or by an inspecting entity approved by the board;

(b) Maintain its records of controlled substances and prescription or legend drugs or devices dispensed to patients in this state so that the records are readily retrievable from the records of other drugs dispensed; and

(c) Certify that it understands Mississippi pharmacy laws and regulations and agrees to comply with those laws and regulations and any other state or federal laws that apply to the practice of pharmacy. The pharmacist-in-charge must hold a Mississippi pharmacist license, be licensed to practice pharmacy in the state of residence of the nonresident pharmacy, and be current and in good standing with the licensing boards of both states.

(3) Any pharmacy subject to this section shall provide during its regular hours of operation, but not less than six (6) days per week and for a minimum of forty (40) hours per week, a toll-free telephone service to facilitate communication between patients in this state and a pharmacist at the pharmacy who has access to the patient's records. This toll-free number shall be disclosed on a label affixed to each container of drugs dispensed to patients in this state.

(4) The permit fee for nonresident pharmacies shall be the same as the fee as set by subsection (4) of Section 73-21-105.

(5) The permit requirements of this section shall apply to any nonresident pharmacy that dispenses, distributes, ships, mails or delivers controlled substances or prescription or legend drugs and devices into this state directly to a consumer.

(6) The board may deny, revoke or suspend a nonresident pharmacy permit only for:

(a) Failure to comply with any requirement of this section or Section 41-29-125;

(b) Conduct that causes serious bodily or serious psychological injury to a resident of this state if the board has referred the matter to the regulatory or licensing agency in the state in

which the pharmacy is located and the regulatory or licensing agency fails to initiate an investigation within forty-five (45) days of the referral; or

(c) Violation of the Uniform Controlled Substances Law.

(7) It is unlawful for any nonresident pharmacy that is not permitted under this section to advertise its services in this state, or for any person who is a resident of this state to advertise the pharmacy services of a nonresident pharmacy that is not permitted with the board, with the knowledge that the advertisement will or is likely to induce members of the public in this state to use the pharmacy to fill prescriptions.

(8) When requested to do so by the board or the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics, each nonresident pharmacy shall supply any inspection reports, controlled substances dispensing records, warning notices, notice of deficiency reports or any other related reports from the state in which it is located concerning the operation of a nonresident pharmacy for review of compliance with state and federal drug laws.

Section 73-21-107. Inspection of permittee's facility and records; scope. Reenact with amendment.

(1) The board or its representative may enter and inspect, during reasonable hours, a any facility ~~which has obtained or applied for a permit under Section 73-21-105~~ identified in the supply chain that ships, or causes to be shipped, or receives any controlled substances or prescription or legend drugs or devices, relative to the following:

(a) Drug storage and security;

(b) Equipment;

(c) Sanitary conditions; or

(d) Records, reports, or other documents required to be kept or made under this chapter or the Uniform Controlled Substances Law (Section 41-29-101 et seq.) or rules and regulations adopted under such laws, or under the Drug Supply Chain Security Act or rules and regulations adopted under such laws.

(2) Prior to an entry and inspection, the board representative shall state his purpose and present appropriate credentials to the owner, pharmacist or agent in charge of a facility.

(3) The board representative may:

(a) Inspect and copy records, reports, and other documents required to be kept or made under this chapter, the Uniform Controlled Substances Law, or rules and regulations adopted under such laws; or under the Drug Supply Chain Security Act or rules and regulations adopted under such laws.

(b) Inspect, within reasonable limits and in a reasonable manner, a facility's storage, equipment, security, records, or prescription drugs or devices; or

(c) Inventory any stock of any prescription drugs or devices in the facility.

(4) Unless the owner, pharmacist, or agent in charge of the facility consents in writing, an inspection authorized by this section may not extend to:

(a) Financial data;

(b) Sales data other than shipment data; or

(c) Pricing data.

Section 73-21-108. Permit requirements for persons providing home medical equipment. Reenact with amendment.

(1) **Definitions.** For the purposes of this section:

(a) "Home medical equipment" means technologically sophisticated medical equipment and devices usable in a home care setting, including, but not limited to:

- (i) Oxygen for human consumption, oxygen concentrators and/or oxygen delivery systems and equipment;
- (ii) Ventilators;
- (iii) Respiratory disease management devices;
- (iv) Electronic and computer driven wheelchairs and seating systems;
- (v) Apnea monitors;
- (vi) Transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulator (TENS) units;
- (vii) Low air loss cutaneous pressure management devices;
- (viii) Sequential compression devices;
- (ix) Neonatal home phototherapy devices;
- (x) Feeding pumps; and
- (xi) Other similar equipment as defined in regulations adopted by the board.

The term "home medical equipment" does not include medical equipment used in the normal course of treating patients by hospitals, hospices, long-term care facilities or home health agencies, or medical equipment used or dispensed by health care professionals licensed by the State of Mississippi if the professional is practicing within the scope of his or her professional practice. In addition, the term does not include items such as upper and lower extremity prosthetics, canes, crutches, walkers, bathtub grab bars, standard wheelchairs, commode chairs and bath benches.

(b) "Home medical equipment services" means the delivery, installation, maintenance, replacement, and/or instruction in the use of home medical equipment, used by a sick or disabled individual, to allow the individual to be cared for and maintained in a home or noninstitutional environment.

(c) "Medical gas" means those gases and liquid oxygen intended for human consumption.

(d) "Order" means an order issued by a licensed practitioner legally authorized to order home medical equipment and/or medical gases.

(2) **Permit required.** (a) No person, business or entity located in this state subject to this section shall sell, rent or provide or offer to sell, rent or provide any home medical equipment, legend devices, and/or medical gas unless such person, business or entity first obtains a Medical Equipment Supplier Permit from the board. Additionally, no person, business or entity located or outside of this state that is subject to this section shall sell, rent or provide or offer to sell, rent or provide directly to patients in this state any home medical equipment, legend devices, and/or medical gas unless such person, business or entity first obtains a Medical Equipment Supplier Permit from the board.

(b) The permitting requirements of this section apply to all persons, companies, agencies and other business entities that are in the business of supplying or coordinating the supply of home medical equipment to patients in their places of residence and that bill the patient or the patient's insurance, Medicare, Medicaid or other third party payor for the rent or sale of that equipment.

(c) The board shall require a separate permit for each facility location directly or indirectly owned or operated in this state.

(d) The application for a permit shall be made to the board on a form supplied by the board and shall be accompanied by a fee of not more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), as prescribed by the board. Once issued, every permit must be renewed annually, and the renewal fee shall be not more than One Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00), as prescribed by the board.

(e) All permits issued under this section shall expire annually on June 30 of each year. Applications for renewal must be made to the board on or before June 30 and must be accompanied by the fee as prescribed by the board. A late renewal fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) shall be added to all renewal applications received by the board after June 30 of each renewal period. The permit shall become void if the renewal application, renewal fee and the late renewal fee are not received by the board by September 30 of each year.

(3) **Exemptions.** (a) The permitting requirements of this section do not apply to the following entities or practitioners unless they have a separate business entity, company, corporation or division that is in the business of providing home medical equipment for sale or rent to patients at their places of residence:

- (i) Home health agencies;
- (ii) Hospitals;
- (iii) Wholesalers and/or manufacturers;
- (iv) Medical doctors, physical therapists, respiratory therapists, occupational therapists, speech pathologists, optometrists, chiropractors and podiatrists who use home medical equipment and/or legend devices in their individual practices;
- (v) Pharmacies;
- (vi) Hospice programs;
- (vii) Nursing homes and/or long-term care facilities;
- (viii) Veterinarians; dentists; and emergency medical services.

(b) Although community pharmacies are exempt from the permitting requirements of this section, they shall be subject to the same regulations that are applicable to permitted businesses or entities for the sale or rental of home medical equipment covered by this section.

(c) Nothing in this section shall prohibit trained individuals from using oxygen, liquid oxygen and/or legend devices in emergencies.

(d) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the prehospital emergency administration of oxygen by licensed health care providers, emergency medical technicians, first responders, firefighters, law enforcement officers and other emergency personnel trained in the proper use of emergency oxygen.

(4) **Order required.** Home medical equipment suppliers shall not provide any home medical equipment to a patient without a valid order from an authorized licensed practitioner.

(5) **Regulations.** The board shall adopt regulations for the distribution and sale or rental of home medical equipment, legend devices and medical gases that promote the public health and welfare and comply with at least the minimum standards, terms and conditions of federal laws and regulations. The regulations shall include, without limitation:

- (a) Minimum information from each home medical equipment, legend device and medical gas supplier required for permitting and renewal permits;
- (b) Minimum qualifications of persons who engage in the distribution of home medical equipment;
- (c) Appropriate education, training or experience of persons employed by home medical equipment suppliers;

- (d) Minimum standards for storage of home medical equipment;
- (e) Minimum requirements for the establishment and maintenance of all records for the sale, rental and servicing of home medical equipment; and
- (f) Minimum standards of operation and professional conduct.

(6) Medical Equipment Advisory Committee to the board.

(a) A Medical Equipment Advisory Committee (MEAC), composed of three (3) members selected by the Mississippi Association of Medical Equipment Suppliers and approved by the board, shall review and make recommendations to the board regarding all regulations dealing with home medical equipment, legend devices and medical gases that are proposed by the board and before they are adopted by the board.

(b) All MEAC members must have been actively involved in the home medical equipment business for a minimum of five (5) years before the selection to the committee and shall hold and maintain, in good standing, a permit issued by the board under this section.

(c) The MEAC members shall meet at least quarterly and review all home medical equipment suppliers' inspection reports. All complaints and reports of investigations of violations of law or regulations regarding home medical equipment, legend devices and medical gases shall first be reviewed by the MEAC. After review, the MEAC may make recommendations to the board's Investigations Review Committee regarding further administrative action by the board.

(d) The MEAC shall keep and maintain minutes of all meetings of the MEAC and shall provide copies of the minutes to the board on a quarterly basis.

(7) Revocation, suspension or restriction of permit and penalties.

(a) The board may revoke, suspend, restrict or refuse to issue or renew a permit or impose a monetary penalty, in accordance with Section 73-21-103 except that the monetary penalty shall not exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per violation, if the business or holder of a permit or applicant for a permit issued under this section has committed or is found guilty by the board of any of the following:

(i) Violation of any federal, state or local law or regulations relating to home medical equipment, legend devices or medical gases.

(ii) Violation of any of the provisions of this section or regulations adopted under this section.

(iii) Commission of an act or engaging in a course of conduct that constitutes a clear and present danger to the public health and safety.

(iv) Filing a claim or assisting in the filing of a claim for reimbursement for home medical equipment or home medical equipment services that were not provided or that were not authorized to be provided.

(v) Failure to comply with any lawful order of the board.

(b) Disciplinary action by the board against a business or any person holding a permit under this section shall be in accordance with Section 73-21-99.

Section 73-21-109. Unlawful use of certain business names. Reenact with no changes

No person shall make use of the terms "drugstore," "pharmacy," "apothecary" or words of similar meaning which indicate that pharmaceutical services are performed in any sign, letterhead or advertisement unless such person is a permit holder as provided in Section 73-21-105, or such property or name was previously registered with the Mississippi State Board of

Pharmacy or provided pharmaceutical services in excess of twenty (20) years. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than ninety (90) days, or by both.

Section 73-21-111. Personnel regulations; registration of pharmacy technicians; annual registration fee; criminal background checks. Reenact with no changes.

(1) The board shall make, adopt, amend and repeal, from time to time, such rules and regulations for the regulation of supportive personnel as may be deemed necessary by the board.

(2) Every person who acts or serves as a pharmacy technician in a pharmacy that is located in this state and permitted by the board shall obtain a registration from the board. To obtain a pharmacy technician registration the applicant must:

- (a) Have submitted a written application on a form(s) prescribed by the board; and
- (b) Be of good moral character; and
- (c) Have paid the initial registration fee not to exceed One Hundred Dollars

(\$100.00).

(3) Each pharmacy technician shall renew his or her registration annually. To renew his or her registration, a technician must:

- (a) Submit an application on a form prescribed by the board; and

(b) Pay a renewal fee not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each annual registration period. The board may add a surcharge of not more than Five Dollars (\$5.00) to the registration renewal fee to assist in funding a program that assists impaired pharmacists, pharmacy students and pharmacy technicians.

(4) To insure that all applicants are of good moral character, the board shall conduct a criminal history records check on all applicants for a license. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for licensing, the applicant shall be fingerprinted. The board shall submit the fingerprints to the Department of Public Safety for a check of the state criminal records and forward to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a check of the national criminal records. The Department of Public Safety shall disseminate the results of the state check and the national check to the board for a suitability determination. The board shall be authorized to collect from the applicant the amount of the fee that the Department of Public Safety charges the board for the fingerprinting, whether manual or electronic, and the state and national criminal history records checks.

Section 73-21-113. Payment and deposit into state treasury of funds received by state board of pharmacy; expenditure. Reenact with no changes.

All fees received by the board from examinations, licenses, permits and monetary penalties, and any other funds received by the board, shall be paid to the State Treasurer, who shall issue receipts therefor and deposit such funds in the State Treasury in a special fund to the credit of the board. All such funds shall be expended only pursuant to appropriation approved by the Legislature and as provided by law.

Section 73-21-115. Prescription forms; execution; dispensing options; one-time emergency dispensing authority. Reenact with no changes.

(1) Every prescription written in this state by a person authorized to issue such prescription shall be on prescription forms containing two (2) lines for the prescriber's signature. There shall be a signature line in the lower right-hand corner of the prescription form beneath which shall be clearly imprinted the words "substitution permissible." There shall be a signature line in the lower left-hand corner of the prescription form beneath which shall be clearly imprinted the words "dispense as written." The prescriber's signature on either signature line shall validate the prescription and shall designate approval or disapproval of product selection.

(2) If a prescription form which does not contain the two (2) signature lines required in subsection (1) of this section is utilized by the prescriber, he shall write in his own handwriting the words "dispense as written" thereupon to prevent product selection.

(3) A pharmacist licensed by the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy may dispense a one-time emergency dispensing of a prescription of up to a seventy-two-hour supply of a prescribed medication in the event the pharmacist is unable to contact the prescriber to obtain refill authorization, provided that:

- (a) The prescription is not for a controlled substance;
- (b) In the pharmacist's professional judgment, the interruption of therapy might reasonably produce undesirable health consequences or may cause physical or mental discomfort;
- (c) The dispensing pharmacist notifies the prescriber or his agent of the emergency dispensing within seven (7) working days after the one-time emergency dispensing;
- (d) The pharmacist properly records the dispensing as a separate nonrefillable prescription. Said document shall be filed as is required of all other prescription records. This document shall be serially numbered and contain all information required of other prescriptions. In addition it shall contain the number of the prescription from which it was refilled; and
- (e) The pharmacist shall record on the new document the circumstances which warrant this emergency dispensing.

This emergency dispensing shall be done only in the permitted facility which contains the nonrefillable prescription.

Section 73-21-117. Substitution of a generic equivalent drug or interchangeable biological product; notice to prescriber that biological product was dispensed. Reenact without changes.

(1) A pharmacist may select a generic equivalent drug product or an interchangeable biological product only when such selection results in lower cost to the purchaser, unless product selection is expressly prohibited by the prescriber.

(2) A pharmacist shall select a generic equivalent drug product or an interchangeable biological product when:

- (a) The purchaser requests the selection of a generic equivalent drug product or an interchangeable biological product; or
- (b) The prescriber has not expressly prohibited product selection; and
- (c) Product selection will result in lower cost to the purchaser.

Before product selection is made, the pharmacist shall advise the purchaser of his prerogatives under this subsection.

(3) When requested by the purchaser to dispense the drug product or biological product as ordered by the prescriber, a pharmacist shall not select a generic equivalent drug product or an interchangeable biological product.

(4) Within five (5) business days following the dispensing of any biological product, the dispensing pharmacist or the pharmacist's designee shall make an entry of the specific product provided to the purchaser, including the name of the product and the manufacturer, and communicate that information to the prescriber. The communication shall be conveyed by making an entry that is electronically accessible to the prescriber through:

- (a) An interoperable electronic medical records system;
- (b) An electronic prescribing technology;
- (c) A pharmacist benefit management system; or
- (d) A pharmacy record.

(5) Entry into an electronic records system as described in subsection (4) of this section is presumed to provide notice to the prescriber. Otherwise, the pharmacist shall communicate the biological product dispensed to the prescriber using facsimile, telephone, electronic transmission, or other prevailing means, provided that communication shall not be required where:

- (a) There is no federal Food and Drug Administration-approved interchangeable biological product for the product prescribed; or
- (b) A refill prescription is not changed from the product dispensed on the prior filling of the prescription.

(6) The board shall maintain a link on its website to the federal Food and Drug Administration's List of Licensed Biological Products with Reference Product Exclusivity and Biosimilarity or Interchangeability Evaluations.

Section 73-21-119. Labeling of drug products, biological products, and interchangeable biological products sold at retail. Reenact without changes.

(1) The label of the container of any drug product which is sold within the State of Mississippi for resale at retail and which requires a prescription to be dispensed at retail shall contain at a minimum the name of the manufacturer of the final dosage unit, expiration date if applicable, batch or lot number and national drug code. The label of the container of any biological product dispensed by a pharmacist shall include its nonproprietary name designated by the federal Food and Drug Administration for use and the name of the manufacturer of the product.

(2) Whenever product selection is made, the pharmacist shall indicate on the label of the dispensed container the initials "G.E." or "I.B.," as appropriate. The label for generic equivalent drugs shall include the proprietary name of the product dispensed or the generic name of the product dispensed and its manufacturer either written in full or appropriately abbreviated, unless the prescriber indicates that the name of the drug product shall not appear on the label. The label for interchangeable biological products shall include its nonproprietary name designated by the federal Food and Drug Administration for use and the name of the manufacturer of the product.

Section 73-21-121. Immunity from civil or criminal liability of dispensing pharmacists and prescribers; immunity from civil liability of persons providing information to board or

pharmacist organization; disclosure of information in records of board or pharmacist organization. Reenact without changes.

(1) Product selection as authorized by Sections 73-21-115 through 73-21-119 shall not constitute evidence of negligence by the dispensing pharmacist when such product selection is in accordance with reasonable and prudent pharmacy practice. No prescriber shall be liable for civil damages or in any criminal prosecution arising from the incorrect product selection by a pharmacist.

(2) Any person having knowledge relating to a pharmacist or to a pharmacy student which might provide grounds for disciplinary action by the board may report relevant facts to the board, and shall by reason of reporting such facts in good faith be immune from civil liability.

(3) Any person furnishing information in the form of data, reports or records to the board or to a pharmacist organization approved by the board to receive such information, where such information is furnished for the purpose of aiding a pharmacist or a pharmacy student impaired by chemical abuse or by mental or by physical illness, shall by reason of furnishing such information in good faith be immune from civil liability.

(4) The records of the board or the records of a pharmacist organization approved by the board to aid pharmacists or pharmacy students impaired by chemical abuse, where such records relate to the impairment, shall be confidential and are not considered open records; provided, however, the board may disclose this confidential information only:

- (a) In a disciplinary hearing before the board, or in an appeal of an action or order of the board;
- (b) To the pharmacist licensing or disciplinary authorities of other jurisdictions in the case of a pharmacist who is licensed in, or seeking transfer to, another state; or
- (c) Pursuant to an order of a court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 73-21-123. Sales of certain drugs not regulated. Reenact without changes.

Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent, or in any manner interfere with, or to require a permit for the sale of nonnarcotic nonprescription drugs which may be lawfully sold under the United States Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (21 USCS 301 et seq. as now or hereafter amended) without a prescription, nor shall any rule or regulation be adopted by the board under the provisions of this chapter which shall require the sale of nonprescription drugs by a licensed pharmacist in a pharmacy or otherwise apply to or interfere with the sale or distribution of such drugs.

Section 73-21-124. Sale and purchase without prescription of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine products permitted; log of each transaction required; minimum age of purchaser; punishment for violation. Reenact without change.

(1)(a) It is lawful for a pharmacy registered under Section 73-21-105 to sell or distribute to a person, without a prescription, products containing not more than three and six tenths (3.6) grams per day and not more than seven and two tenths (7.2) grams per thirty-day period of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine, and it is lawful for a person to purchase products containing those ingredients from a registered pharmacy without a prescription.

(b) All products authorized under this subsection (1) must be stored by a pharmacy by placing the products behind a counter in an area within the pharmacy where the public is not permitted.

(c) Any products authorized under this subsection (1) sold by a pharmacy must be sold by an individual licensed as a pharmacist or by an employee of the pharmacy under the direct supervision and control of a licensed pharmacist.

(d) No pharmacy may sell or distribute, and no person may purchase, more products than allowed under this section unless by valid prescription. It is not a defense in a prosecution under this section that no money was exchanged during a transaction that would otherwise be unlawful under this section.

(2) A pharmacy selling products in a manner authorized under subsection (1) of this section must:

(a) Use the National Precursor Log Exchange (NPLEX) system administered by the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators, provided that the system is available to pharmacies or retailers in the state without a charge for accessing the NPLEX system, before completing the over-the-counter sale of each product authorized under subsection (1) of this section. Before completing a sale of an over-the-counter material, compound, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers a pharmacy or retailer shall electronically submit the information required under subsection (b) of this subsection (2) to the NPLEX system. The pharmacy or retailer shall not complete the sale if the NPLEX system generates a stop-sale alert. The system shall contain an override function that may be used by an agent of a retail establishment who is dispensing the drug product, and who has a reasonable fear of imminent bodily harm if the transaction is not completed. The system shall create a record of each use of the override mechanism.

(b) Maintain an electronic log of required information for each transaction, and require the purchaser of the package to be at least eighteen (18) years of age and provide a valid, unsuspended driver's license or nondriver identification card issued by this state or another state, a United States Uniformed Services Privilege and Identification Card, or a United States or foreign passport, and to sign a written or electronic log attesting to the validity of the information provided for each transaction. The record of each transaction must include the information from the identification card as well as the type of and government entity issuing the identification card used, the name, date of birth, and current address of the purchaser, the date and time of the sale, the name of the compound, mixture, or preparation being sold, and the total amount, in grams or milligrams, of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine being sold.

(c) Maintain a written log or an alternative electronic recordkeeping mechanism if a pharmacy or retailer experiences mechanical or electronic failure of the required electronic tracking system until such time as the pharmacy or retailer is able to comply with the electronic sales-tracking requirement. No person shall purchase, receive or otherwise acquire more than three and six-tenths (3.6) grams per day or seven and two-tenths (7.2) grams of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine within any thirty-day period.

(3) The National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators shall provide real-time access to the NPLEX information through the NPLEX online portal to law enforcement in the state.

(4)(a) Pseudoephedrine and ephedrine products dispensed pursuant to a legitimate prescription are exempt from this section.

(b) The amounts of pseudoephedrine and ephedrine products dispensed to a person pursuant to a legitimate prescription shall not be considered under subsection (1)(a) of this section.

(5) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor and is punishable as follows:

(a) For a first offense, by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

(b) For a second or subsequent offense, by a fine not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

(6) A pharmacist who is the general owner or operator of an establishment where pseudoephedrine and ephedrine products are available for sale shall not be penalized under this section for the conduct of an employee if the retailer documents that an employee training program approved by the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy was conducted by the pharmacist. The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy shall develop or approve all training programs for pharmacy employees.

(7) A person who resides in a state that requires a prescription for the purchase of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine, or who presents identification from a state that requires a prescription for the purchase of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine, may purchase those products only upon presentation of a valid prescription for the pseudoephedrine or ephedrine.

Section 73-21-125. ~~Community~~ Charity pharmacies and pharmacists and volunteers working therein immune from civil liability for actions arising out of provision of charitable or gratuitous pharmaceutical products. Reenact with amendment.

(1) Any ~~community~~ charity pharmacy, including a faith-based ~~community~~ charity pharmacy, or any licensed pharmacist who voluntarily provides charitable services in a ~~community~~ charity pharmacy, or any other person who serves as a volunteer in a ~~community~~ charity pharmacy, shall be immune from liability for any civil action arising out of supplying pharmaceutical products in the course of providing such charitable or gratuitous pharmaceutical products. This section shall not extend immunity to acts of gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct or to the manufacturer or designer of products provided.

(2) Any ~~community~~ charity pharmacy seeking immunity under this section shall post a notice, in a conspicuous place adjacent to the area where prescriptions are picked up by consumers, reading substantially as follows: "NOTICE: If you are harmed by medication that you receive here, you do not have the same legal recourse as you have against other pharmacies." Failure to post the notice negates the immunity from liability provided under this section. The notice shall be no less than eleven (11) by fourteen (14) inches in size, and the type used shall be no smaller than thirty-six (36) point and surrounded by a one-inch solid black border.

(3) For purposes of this section, "~~community~~ charity pharmacy" means a pharmacy operated solely for charitable purposes, whose only function is to supply gratuitous pharmaceutical products, and which is operated by a nonprofit organization qualified or eligible for qualification as a tax-exempt organization under 26 USCS 501.

Section 73-21-126. Rules and regulations for issuance and renewal of licenses and permits for in and out of state ~~wholesale distributors, chain pharmacy warehouses and repackagers~~

persons, businesses and entities shipping into, within, or out of the state. Reenact with amendment.

(1) The State Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate rules regarding the issuance and renewal of licenses and permits for new or renewal application requirements for both in- and out-of-state ~~wholesale distributors, chain pharmacy warehouses and repackagers~~ persons, businesses and entities owning or shipping into, within in, or out of Mississippi. Requirements for new and/or renewal applications, if information has not been previously provided to the board, will include, but not be limited to, the following:

- (a) Type of ownership (individual, partnership or corporation);
- (b) Names of principal owners or officers and social security numbers;
- (c) Names of designated representatives and social security numbers;
- (d) Criminal background checks of applicants and designated representatives as required by rule;
- (e) Copy of license in home state;
- (f) Bond requirements.

(2) To ensure that all applicants are of good moral character, the board shall conduct a criminal history records check on all applicants for a license. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for licensing, the applicant shall be fingerprinted. ~~(4) Pharmacies shall not be responsible for verification or adjudication of the pedigree for pharmaceuticals.~~

~~(5) The board may exempt wholesalers accredited by the VAWD program from the above requirements.~~

Section 73-21-127. Board of Pharmacy to develop and implement computerized program to track certain prescriptions; report of suspected abuse and misuse of controlled substances; access to collected data; confidentiality; penalties for knowingly failing to submit or submitting incorrect dispensing information. Reenact with amendment.

(1) The Board of Pharmacy shall develop and implement a computerized program to track prescriptions for controlled substances and to report suspected abuse and misuse of controlled substances in compliance with the federal regulations promulgated under authority of the National All Schedules Prescription Electronic Reporting Act of 2005 and in compliance with the federal HIPAA law, under the following conditions:

(a) Submission or reporting of dispensing information shall be mandatory and required by the State Board of Pharmacy for any entity dispensing controlled substances in or into the State of Mississippi, except for the dispensing of controlled substance drugs by a veterinarian residing in the State of Mississippi.

(b) The prescriptions tracked shall be prescriptions for controlled substances listed in Schedule II, III, IV or V and specified noncontrolled substances identified by the State Board of Pharmacy that are dispensed to residents in the State of Mississippi by licensed pharmacies, nonresident pharmacies, institutions and dispensing practitioners, regardless of dispenser location.

(c) The Board of Pharmacy shall report any activity it reasonably suspects may be fraudulent or illegal to the appropriate law enforcement agency or occupational licensing board and provide them with the relevant information obtained for further investigation.

(d) ~~The program shall provide information regarding the potential inappropriate use of controlled substances and the specified noncontrolled substances to practitioners, pharmacists in charge and appropriate state agencies in order to prevent the inappropriate or illegal use of these controlled substances.~~ The specific purposes of the program shall be to: be proactive in safeguarding public health and safety; support the legitimate use of controlled substances; facilitate and encourage the identification, intervention with and treatment of individuals addicted to controlled substances and specified noncontrolled drugs; identify and prevent drug diversion; provide assistance to those state and federal law enforcement and regulatory agencies investigating cases of drug diversion or other misuse; ~~and~~ inform the public and health care professionals of the use and abuse trends related to controlled substance and specified noncontrolled drugs; and prevent the inappropriate or illegal use of these controlled substances.

(e)(i) Access to collected data shall be confidential and not subject to the provisions of the federal Freedom of Information Act or the Mississippi Public Records Act. Upon request, the State Board of Pharmacy shall provide collected information to: pharmacists or practitioners who are properly registered with the State Board of Pharmacy and are authorized to prescribe or dispense controlled substances for the limited purpose of providing medical and pharmaceutical care for their patients; local, state and federal law enforcement officials engaged in the administration, investigation or enforcement of the laws governing illicit drug use; regulatory and licensing boards in this state; Division of Medicaid regarding Medicaid and Medicare Program recipients; judicial authorities under grand jury subpoena or court order; an individual who requests the individual's own prescription monitoring information; and prescription monitoring programs in other states through mutual agreement adhering to State Board of Pharmacy policies.

(ii) The Director of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics, or his designee, shall have access to the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) database for the purpose of investigating the potential illegal acquisition, distribution, dispensing, prescribing or administering of the controlled and noncontrolled substances monitored by the program, subject to all legal restrictions on further dissemination of the information obtained.

(iii) The State Board of Pharmacy may also provide statistical data for research or educational purposes if the board determines the use of the data to be of significant benefit to public health and safety. The board maintains the right to refuse any request for PMP data.

(iv) A pharmacist licensed by the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy must be a registered user of the PMP. Failure of a pharmacist licensed by the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy to register as a user of the PMP is grounds for disciplinary action by the board.

(v) All licensed practitioners as defined under Section 73-21-73~~(ee)~~ holding an active DEA number shall register as users of the PMP.

(f) The Prescription Monitoring Program through the Board of Pharmacy may:

(i) Establish the cost of administration, maintenance, and operation of the program and charge to like agencies a fee based on a formula to be determined by the board with collaboration and input from participating agencies; and

(ii) Assess charges for information and/or statistical data provided to agencies, institutions and individuals. The amounts of those fees shall be set by the Executive Director of the Board of Pharmacy based on the recommendation of the Director of the PMP.

All such fees collected shall be deposited into the special fund of the State Board of Pharmacy and used to support the operations of the PMP.

(g) A dispenser pharmacist or practitioner licensed to dispense controlled substances and specified noncontrolled substance drugs who knowingly fails to submit drug-monitoring information or knowingly submits incorrect dispensing information shall be subject to actions against the pharmacist's or practitioner's license, registrations or permit and/or an administrative penalty as provided in Sections 73-21-97 and 73-21-103. Any misuse of the PMP is subject to penalties as provided in Sections 73-21-97 and 73-21-103.

(h) The Board of Pharmacy and the Prescription Monitoring Program shall be immune from civil liability arising from inaccuracy of any of the information submitted to the program.

(i) "Practitioner," as used in this section, shall include any person licensed, registered or otherwise permitted to distribute, dispense, prescribe or administer a controlled substance, as defined under Section 41-29-105~~(y)~~, and any person defined as a "practitioner" under Section 73-21-73~~(ee)~~.

(j) In addition to any funds appropriated by the Legislature, the State Board of Pharmacy may apply for any available grants and accept any gifts, grants or donations to assist in future development or in maintaining the program.

(2) In addition to receiving the dispensing information regarding controlled substances as provided in subsection (1) of this section, the State Board of Pharmacy shall receive and maintain in the Prescription Monitoring Program (a) the medical cannabis dispensing information that medical cannabis dispensaries under the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act are required to report to the PMP under Section 41-137-33, and (b) any other medical cannabis dispensing information that dispensaries are required to report to the PMP. The medical cannabis dispensing information reported by medical cannabis dispensaries under Section 41-137-33 shall not be considered to be a prescription for the purposes of the Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Act or the Uniform Controlled Substances Law.

Section 73-21-127.1. Annual Prescription Monitoring Program report on number of opioid prescriptions provided to patients. Reenact with amendment.

The Prescription Monitoring Program shall ~~issue a~~ provide, upon request, a report each year to the Legislature that indicates the number of opioid prescriptions that were provided to patients during that year.

Section 73-21-129. Certain drug manufacturers required to make provision of return of outdated drugs from pharmacies; investigation and discipline of noncompliant manufacturers; exemption; definitions. Reenact with amendment.

(1) Each manufacturer whose products are distributed within the State of Mississippi shall make adequate provision for the return of outdated drugs from pharmacies, both full and partial containers, excluding biological, infused or intravenously injected drugs and drugs that are inhaled during surgery, within six (6) months after the labeled expiration date, for prompt full credit or refund.

(2) ~~Wholesale distributors and reverse distributors~~ Any entity assisting with the return of outdated drugs to a manufacturer on behalf of a pharmacy that are required to register with the board and have a permit under Section 73-21-105 and shall implement and administer the return policies established by the manufacturer.

(3) If the board receives information that a manufacturer has failed to comply with this section, the board shall investigate the matter and present any evidence of the manufacturer's failure to comply to ~~a review committee composed of the Dean of the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy, the Executive Director of the State Board of Pharmacy and the Director of the Pharmacy Bureau of the Division of Medicaid, or the designee of any of those officials~~ the Investigations Review Committee and follow the procedures outlined in Section 73-21-99. The committee shall review the evidence of the manufacturer's failure to comply with this section and make a recommendation to the board regarding the discipline of the manufacturer for its failure to comply. After the board has received the recommendation of the committee, t The board may discipline the manufacturer by providing that the manufacturer's products shall be ineligible for use in product selection in any state drug assistance programs, in addition to any other penalties authorized pursuant to this Act.

(4) A pharmacist may not dispense a prescription drug or controlled drug unless the pharmacist has satisfactory evidence that the manufacturer of the drug has a procedure for the return of expired drugs.

(5) ~~Any manufacturer that had a repurchase program in place on January 1, 2008, shall be exempt from the provisions of this section, provided that the repurchase program makes provision for the repurchase of outdated drugs in either full or partial amounts within six (6) months after the labeled expiration date.~~

(6) As used in this section, the term "biological drug" or "biological product" means a virus, therapeutic serum, toxin, antitoxin, vaccine, blood, blood component or derivative, allergenic product or analogous product, or arsphenamine or derivative of arsphenamine or any other trivalent organic arsenic compound, applicable to the prevention, treatment or cure of a disease or condition of human beings.

(~~d~~ e) "Electronic claim" means the transmission of data for purposes of payment of covered prescription drugs, other products and supplies, and pharmacist services in an electronic data format specified by a pharmacy benefit manager and approved by the department.

(~~e~~ f) "Electronic adjudication" means the process of electronically receiving ; and reviewing an electronic claim and either accepting and providing payment remittance advice for the electronic claim or rejecting ~~an~~ the electronic claim.

(~~f~~ g) "Enrollee" means an individual who has been enrolled in a pharmacy benefit management plan or health insurance plan.

(~~g~~ h) "Health insurance plan" means benefits consisting of prescription drugs, other products and supplies, and pharmacist services provided directly, through insurance or reimbursement, or otherwise and including items and services paid for as prescription drugs,

other products and supplies, and pharmacist services under any hospital or medical service policy or certificate, hospital or medical service plan contract, preferred provider organization agreement, or health maintenance organization contract offered by a health insurance issuer.

(i) "Network pharmacy" means a pharmacy licensed by the Board and provides pharmacy services to Mississippi consumers and has a contract with a pharmacy benefit manager to provide covered drugs at a negotiated reimbursement rate.

(j) "Payment remittance advice" means the claim detail that the pharmacy receives when successfully processing an electronic or paper claim. The claim detail shall contain, but is not limited to:

(i) The amount that the pharmacy benefit manager will reimburse for product ingredient; and

(ii) The amount that the pharmacy benefit manager will reimburse for product dispensing fee; and

(iii) The amount that the pharmacy benefit manager dictates the patient must pay.

(k) "Pharmacist," ~~"pharmacist services"~~ and "pharmacy" or ~~"pharmacies"~~ shall have the same definitions as provided in Section 73-21-73.

(~~h~~) "Pharmacy benefit manager" means an entity that provides pharmacy benefit management services.~~shall have the same definition as provided in Section 73-21-179. However, through June 30, 2014, the term "pharmacy benefit manager" shall not include an insurance company that provides an integrated health benefit plan and that does not separately contract for pharmacy benefit management services. From and after July 1, 2014, t~~The term "pharmacy benefit manager" shall not include;

(i) ~~a~~An insurance company unless the insurance company is providing services as a pharmacy benefit manager ~~as defined in Section 73-21-179~~, in which case the insurance company shall be subject to Sections 73-21-151 through ~~73-21-159~~ 73-21-163 only for those pharmacy benefit manager services, and. (jn) "Pharmacy benefit management plan" ~~shall have the same definition as provided in Section 73-21-179.~~ means an arrangement for the delivery of pharmacist's services in which a pharmacy benefit manager undertakes to administer the payment or reimbursement of any of the costs of pharmacist's services, drugs, or devices.

(ko) Pharmacy benefit management services shall include, but is not limited to, the following services, which may be provided either directly or through outsourcing or contracts:

- (i) Adjudicate drug claims or any portion of the transaction.
- (ii) Contract with retail and mail pharmacy networks.
- (iii) Establish payment levels for pharmacies.
- (iv) Develop formulary or drug list of covered therapies.
- (v) Provide benefit design consultation.

(vi) Manage cost and utilization trends.

(vii) Contract for manufacturer rebates.

(viii) Provide fee-based clinical services to improve member care

(ix) Third-party administration.

(x) Sponsoring or providing cash discount cards as defined in Section 83-9-6.1, and also electronic discount cards.

(p) "Pharmacy services" means products, goods, and services, or any combination of products, goods, and services, provided as part of the practice of pharmacy.

(q) "Pharmacy services administrative organization" means any entity that contracts with a pharmacy or pharmacist to assist with third-party payer interactions and that may provide a variety of other administrative services, including but not limited to contracting with pharmacy benefits managers on behalf of pharmacies and providing pharmacies with credentialing, billing, audit, general business, and analytic support.

(~~m~~) "Plan sponsors" means the employers, insurance companies, unions and health maintenance organizations that contract, either directly or indirectly, with a pharmacy benefit manager for delivery of prescription drugs and/or services.

(s) "Rebate" means any and all payments and price concessions that accrue to a pharmacy benefits manager or its plan sponsor client, directly or indirectly, including through an affiliate, subsidiary, third party, or intermediary, including off-shore group purchasing organizations, from a pharmaceutical manufacturer, its affiliate, subsidiary, third party, or intermediary, including but not limited to payments, discounts, administration fees, credits, incentives, or penalties associated directly or indirectly in any way with claims administered on behalf of a plan sponsor.

(4t) "Uniform claim form" means a form prescribed by rule by the Bboard; however, for purposes of Sections 73-21-151 through ~~73-21-159~~ 73-21-163, the Bboard shall adopt the same definition or rule where the State Department of Insurance has adopted a rule covering the same type of claim. The Bboard may modify the terminology of the rule and form when necessary to comply with the provisions of Sections 73-21-151 through ~~73-21-159~~ 73-21-163.

(t) "Wholesale acquisition cost" means the wholesale acquisition cost of the drug as defined in 42 USC Section 1395w-3a(c)(6)(B).

Benefits ~~due under the plan and claims~~ are overdue if not paid within seven (7) days or thirty-five (35) days, whichever is applicable, after the pharmacy benefit manager receives a clean claim containing necessary information essential for the pharmacy benefit manager to administer preexisting condition, coordination of benefits and subrogation provisions under the plan sponsor's health insurance plan. A "clean claim" means a claim received by any pharmacy benefit manager for adjudication and which requires no further information, adjustment or alteration by the pharmacist or pharmacies or the insured in order to be processed and paid by the pharmacy benefit manager. A claim is clean if it has no defect or impropriety, including any lack of substantiating documentation, or particular circumstance requiring special treatment that prevents timely payment from being made on the claim under this subsection. A clean claim includes resubmitted claims with previously identified deficiencies corrected.

- ~~(i) A duplicate claim, which means an original claim and its duplicate when the duplicate is filed within thirty (30) days of the original claim;~~
- ~~(ii) Claims which are submitted fraudulently or that are based upon material misrepresentations;~~
- ~~(iii) Claims that require information essential for the pharmacy benefit manager to administer preexisting condition, coordination of benefits or subrogation provisions under the plan sponsor's health insurance plan; or~~
- ~~(iv) Claims submitted by a pharmacist or pharmacy more than thirty (30) days after the date of service; if the pharmacist or pharmacy does not submit the claim on behalf of the insured, then a~~

~~(eb) Not later than seven (7) days after the date the pharmacy benefit manager actually receives~~ If an electronic claim is denied, the pharmacy benefit manager shall ~~pay the appropriate benefit in full, or any portion of the claim that is clean, and~~ notify the pharmacist or pharmacy ~~(where the claim is owed to the pharmacist or pharmacy) within seven (7) days of the reasons why the claim or portion thereof is not clean and will not be paid and what substantiating documentation and information is required to adjudicate the claim as clean. (4) If the Board finds that any pharmacy benefit manager, agent or other party responsible for reimbursement for prescription drugs and other products and supplies has not paid ninety-five percent (95%) of clean claims as defined in subsection (3) of this section received from all pharmacies in a calendar quarter, he shall be subject to administrative penalty of not more than Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) to be assessed by the ~~State~~ Board of ~~Pharmacy~~.

(a) Examinations to determine compliance with this ~~subsection~~ may be conducted by the ~~B~~board. The ~~B~~board may contract with qualified impartial outside sources to assist in examinations to determine compliance. ~~The expenses of any such examinations shall be paid by the pharmacy benefit manager examined.~~

(b) Nothing in the provisions of this section shall require a pharmacy benefit manager to pay claims that are not covered under the terms of a contract or policy of accident and sickness insurance or prepaid coverage.

(c) ~~(d)~~ Any pharmacy benefit manager and a pharmacy may enter into an express written agreement containing timely claim payment provisions which differ from, but are at least as stringent as, the provisions set forth under subsection (3) of this section, and in such case, the provisions of the written agreement shall govern the timely payment of claims by the pharmacy benefit manager to the pharmacy. If the express written agreement is silent as to any interest penalty where claims are not paid in accordance with the agreement, the interest penalty provision of ~~subsection (4)~~ (c) paragraph (c) of this ~~subsection~~ shall apply.

SECTION 3. Section 73-21-156, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

Section 73-21-156. (1) As used in this section, the following terms shall be defined as provided in this subsection:

(a) "Maximum allowable cost list" means a listing of drugs or other methodology, used by a pharmacy benefit manager, directly or indirectly, setting the maximum allowable payment

to a pharmacy or pharmacist for a generic drug, brand-name drug, biologic product or other prescription drug. The ~~term~~ "maximum allowable cost list" utilized by a pharmacy benefit manager shall comply with Section 73-21-155 and includes without limitation:

- (i) ~~Average acquisition cost, including national average drug acquisition cost;~~
- (ii) ~~Average manufacturer price;~~
- (iii) ~~Average wholesale price;~~
- (iv) ~~Brand effective rate or generic effective rate;~~
- (v) ~~Discount indexing;~~
- (vi) ~~Federal upper limits;~~
- (vii) ~~Wholesale acquisition cost; and~~
- (viii) ~~Any other term that a pharmacy benefit manager or a health care insurer~~

may use to establish reimbursement rates to a pharmacist or pharmacy for pharmacist services.

(b) "Pharmacy acquisition cost" means the amount that a pharmaceutical wholesaler charges for a pharmaceutical product as listed on the pharmacy's billing invoice.

(2) Before a pharmacy benefit manager places or continues a particular drug on a maximum allowable cost list, the drug:

(a) If the drug is a generic equivalent drug product as defined in Section 73-21-73, shall be listed as therapeutically equivalent and pharmaceutically equivalent "A" or "B" rated in the United States Food and Drug Administration's most recent version of the "Orange Book" or "Green Book" or have an NR or NA rating by Medi-Span, Gold Standard, or a similar rating by a nationally recognized reference approved by the Board ;

(b) Shall be available for purchase by each pharmacy in the state from national or regional wholesalers operating in Mississippi; and

(c) Shall not be obsolete.

(3) A pharmacy benefit manager shall:

(a) Provide access to its maximum allowable cost list to each pharmacy subject to the maximum allowable cost list;

(b) Update its maximum allowable cost list on a timely basis, but in no event longer than three (3) calendar days; and

(c) Provide a process for each pharmacy subject to the maximum allowable cost list to receive prompt notification of an update to the maximum allowable cost list.

(4) A pharmacy benefit manager shall:

(a) Provide a reasonable administrative appeal procedure to allow pharmacies to challenge ~~a maximum allowable cost list and reimbursements made under a maximum allowable cost list~~ for a specific drug or drugs as:

(i) Not meeting the requirements of this section; or

(ii) Being below the pharmacy acquisition cost.

(b) The reasonable administrative appeal procedure shall include the following:

(i) A ~~dedicated~~ direct telephone number, email address and website for the purpose of submitting administrative appeals;

(ii) The website of the pharmacy benefit manager shall include easily accessible administrative appeal instructions, including listing any required information to be submitted by pharmacies for the purpose of submitting administrative appeals;

(~~ii~~ iii) The ability to submit an administrative appeal directly to the pharmacy benefit manager ~~regarding the pharmacy benefit management plan~~ or through a pharmacy service administrative organization; and

(iii iv) A period of no less than thirty (30) ~~business~~ days to file an administrative appeal.

(c) The pharmacy benefit manager shall respond to the challenge under paragraph (a) of this subsection (4) within thirty (30) ~~business~~ days after receipt of the challenge.

(d) If a challenge is made under paragraph (a) of this subsection (4), the pharmacy benefit manager shall within thirty (30) ~~business~~ days after receipt of the challenge either:

(i) If Uphold the appeal is ~~upheld~~ and adjust the reimbursement paid to the pharmacist or pharmacy to no less than the pharmacy acquisition cost, as documented on the pharmacist's or pharmacy's billing invoice, and

~~2. Permit the challenging pharmacy or pharmacist to reverse and rebill the claim in question;~~

(ii) If Deny the appeal is ~~denied~~, and provide the reason for the denial in writing to the pharmacist or pharmacy, provide the challenging pharmacy or pharmacist the National Drug Code and the name of the national or regional pharmaceutical wholesalers operating in Mississippi that have the drug currently in stock at a price below the maximum allowable cost as listed on the maximum allowable cost list; or

(iii) ~~If the National Drug Code provided by the pharmacy benefit manager is not available below the pharmacy acquisition cost from the pharmaceutical wholesaler from whom the pharmacy or pharmacist purchases the majority of prescription drugs for resale, then the pharmacy benefit manager shall adjust the maximum allowable cost as listed on the maximum allowable cost list above the challenging pharmacy's pharmacy acquisition cost and permit the pharmacy to reverse and rebill each claim affected by the inability to procure the drug at a cost that is equal to or less than the previously challenged maximum allowable cost.~~

(5) A pharmacy benefit manager shall not deny an appeal submitted pursuant to subsection (4) based upon an existing contract with the pharmacy that provides for a reimbursement rate lower than the pharmacy acquisition cost.

(6) A pharmacy or pharmacist that belongs to a pharmacy services administrative organization shall be provided a true and correct copy of any contract that the pharmacy services administrative organization enters into with a pharmacy benefit manager or third-party payer on the pharmacy's or pharmacist's behalf.

(57) (a) A pharmacy benefit manager shall not reimburse a pharmacy or pharmacist in the state an amount less than the amount that the pharmacy benefit manager reimburses a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate for providing the same ~~pharmacist services~~ drug or drugs.

(b) The reimbursement amount for such drug or drugs shall be calculated on a per unit basis based on the same brand and generic product identifier or brand and generic code number.

SECTION 4. Section 73-21-157, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

73-21-157. (1) Before beginning to do business as a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy services administrative organization, a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy services administrative organization shall obtain a license to do business from the Bboard . To

obtain a license, the applicant shall submit an application to the Bboard on a form to be prescribed by the Bboard. This license shall be renewed annually.

(2) When applying for a license or renewal of a license, Each pharmacy benefit manager providing pharmacy management benefit plans in this state shall file a statement with the Bboard annually by March 1 or within sixty (60) days of the end of its fiscal year if not a calendar year. ;
The statement shall be verified by at least two (2) principal officers and shall cover the preceding calendar year or the immediately preceding fiscal year of the pharmacy benefit manager.

(3) The statement shall be on forms prescribed by the board and shall include:

(a) A copy of a certified audit report, if the pharmacy benefit manager has been audited by a certified public accountant within the last twenty-four (24) months; or

(ab) If the pharmacy benefit manager has not been audited in the last twenty-four (24) months, A a financial statement of the organization, including its balance sheet and income statement for the preceding year which shall be verified by at least two (2) principal officers; and

(bc) Any other information relating to the operations of the pharmacy benefit manager required by the Bboard under this section.

(43)(a) Any information required to be submitted to the Bboard pursuant to licensure application that is considered proprietary by a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy services administrative organization shall be marked as confidential when submitted to the Bboard. All such information shall not be subject to the provisions of the federal Freedom of Information Act or the Mississippi Public Records Act and shall not be released by the Bboard unless subject to an order from a court of competent jurisdiction. The Bboard shall destroy or delete or cause to be destroyed or deleted all such information thirty (30) days after the Bboard determines that the information is no longer necessary or useful.

(b) Any person who knowingly releases, causes to be released or assists in the release of any such information shall be subject to a monetary penalty imposed by the Board in an amount not exceeding Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per violation. When the Board is considering the imposition of any penalty under this paragraph (b), it shall follow the same policies and procedures provided for the imposition of other sanctions in the Pharmacy Practice Act. Any penalty collected under this paragraph (b) shall be deposited into the special fund of the Board and used to support the operations of the Board relating to the regulation of pharmacy benefit managers.

(c) All employees of the Board who have access to the information described in paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be fingerprinted, and the Board shall submit a set of fingerprints for each employee to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of conducting a criminal history records check. If no disqualifying record is identified at the state level, the Department of Public Safety shall forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history records check.

~~(4) If the pharmacy benefit manager is audited annually by an independent certified public accountant, a copy of the certified audit report shall be filed annually with the board by June 30 or within thirty (30) days of the report being final.~~

~~(6) The board may extend the time prescribed for any pharmacy benefit manager for filing annual statements or other reports or exhibits of any kind for good cause shown. However, the board shall not extend the time for filing annual statements beyond sixty (60) days after the time prescribed by subsection (1) of this section. The Board may waive the requirements for filing financial information for the pharmacy benefit manager if an affiliate of the pharmacy benefit manager is already required to file such information under current law with the Commissioner of~~

Insurance and allow the pharmacy benefit manager to file a copy of documents containing such information with the Board in lieu of the statement required by this section.

(~~75~~) The expense of administering this section shall be assessed annually by the Board against all pharmacy benefit managers and pharmacy services administrative organization operating in this state.

(~~86~~) A pharmacy benefit manager or third-party payor ~~may~~ shall not require pharmacy accreditation standards or recertification requirements inconsistent with, more stringent than, or in addition to federal and state requirements for licensure as a pharmacy in this state.

SECTION 5. The following shall be codified as Section 73-21-158, Mississippi Code of 1972:

73-21-158. (1) A pharmacy benefit manager shall be prohibited from charging a plan sponsor more for a prescription drug than the net amount it pays a pharmacy for the prescription drug. Separately identified administrative fees or costs are exempt from this requirement, if mutually agreed upon in writing by the payor and pharmacy benefit manager.

(2) A pharmacy benefit manager or third-party payer shall not charge or cause a patient to pay an amount that exceeds the total amount retained by the pharmacy.

(3) A pharmacy benefits manager shall pass on to the plan sponsor One Hundred percent (100%) of all rebates and other payments it receives directly or indirectly from pharmaceutical manufacturers in connection with claims administered on behalf of such plan sponsor. In addition, a pharmacy benefits manager shall report annually to each plan sponsor the aggregate amount of all rebates and other payments that the pharmacy benefits manager received from pharmaceutical manufacturers in connection with claims if administered on behalf of the plan sponsor.

SECTION 6. Section 73-21-161, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

73-21-161. (1) As used in this section, the term "~~referral~~ steering" means:

~~(a) Ordering of a patient to a by a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate either orally or in writing, including online messaging;~~

~~(b) Offering or implementing plan designs that require patients to use affiliated pharmacies; or~~

~~(c) Patient or prospective patient specific advertising, marketing, or promotion of a pharmacy by an affiliate.~~

(a) directing, ordering, or requiring a patient to use a specific pharmacy or pharmacies, including an affiliate pharmacy or pharmacies, for the purpose of filling a prescription or receiving services or other care from a pharmacist;

(b) offering or implementing health insurance plan designs that require a beneficiary to utilize a pharmacy or pharmacies, including an affiliate pharmacy or pharmacies, or that increases costs to a patient, including requiring a patient to pay the full cost for a prescription drug when such patient chooses not to use a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate pharmacy;

(c) advertising, marketing, or promoting a pharmacy, including an affiliate pharmacy or pharmacies, over another in-network pharmacy;

(d) creating any network or engaging in any practice, including accreditation or credentialing standards, day supply limitations, or delivery methods limitations, that exclude an in-network pharmacy or restrict an in-network pharmacy from filling a prescription for a prescription drug; or

(e) directly or indirectly engaging in any practice that attempts to influence or induce a pharmaceutical manufacturer to limit the distribution of a prescription drug to a small number of

pharmacies or certain types of pharmacies, or to restrict distribution of such drug to non-affiliate pharmacies.

The term "~~referral~~ steering" does not include a pharmacy's inclusion by a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy benefit manager affiliate in communications to patients, including patient and prospective patient specific communications, regarding network pharmacies and prices, provided that the pharmacy benefit manager or a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate includes information regarding eligible nonaffiliate pharmacies in those communications and the information provided is accurate.

(2) A pharmacy, pharmacy benefit manager, or pharmacy benefit manager affiliate licensed or operating in Mississippi shall be prohibited from:

(a) ~~Making referrals~~ Steering;

(b) Transferring or sharing records relative to prescription information containing patient identifiable and prescriber identifiable data to or from a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate for any commercial purpose; however, nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the exchange of prescription information between a pharmacy and its affiliate for the limited purposes of pharmacy reimbursement; formulary compliance; pharmacy care; public health activities otherwise authorized by law; or utilization review by a health care provider; ~~or~~

(c) Presenting a claim for payment to any individual, third-party payor, affiliate, or other entity for a service furnished ~~pursuant to a referral by steering from an~~ a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy benefit manager affiliate; or

(d) Interfering with the patient's right to choose the patient's pharmacy or provider of choice, including inducement, required referrals or offering financial or other incentives or measures that would constitute a violation of Section 83-9-6.

(3) This section shall not be construed to prohibit a pharmacy from entering into an agreement with a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy benefit manager affiliate to provide pharmacy care to patients, provided that neither the pharmacy nor the pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy benefit manager affiliate ~~does not receive referrals in violation of~~ violate subsection (2) of this section and the pharmacy provides the disclosures required in subsection (1) of this section.

~~(4) If a pharmacy licensed or holding a nonresident pharmacy permit in this state has an affiliate, it shall annually file with the board a disclosure statement identifying all such affiliates.~~

~~(5)~~ In addition to any other remedy provided by law, a violation of this section by a pharmacy shall be grounds for disciplinary action by the Board under its authority granted in this chapter.

~~(6)~~ A pharmacist who fills a prescription that violates subsection (2) of this section shall not be liable under this section.

SECTION 7. The following shall be codified as Section 73-21-162, Mississippi Code of 1972:

73-21-162. (1) Retaliation is prohibited.

(a) A pharmacy benefit manager shall not retaliate against a pharmacist or pharmacy based on the pharmacist's or pharmacy's exercise of any right or remedy under this chapter. Retaliation prohibited by this section includes, but is not limited to:

- (i) Terminating or refusing to renew a contract with the pharmacist or pharmacy;
- (ii) Subjecting the pharmacist or pharmacy to an increased frequency of audits, number of claims audited, or amount of monies for claims audited; or
- (iii) Failing to promptly pay the pharmacist or pharmacy any money owed by the pharmacy benefit manager to the pharmacist or pharmacy.

(b) For the purposes of this section, a pharmacy benefit manager is not considered to have retaliated against a pharmacist if the pharmacy benefit manager:

(i) Takes an action in response to a credible allegation of fraud against the pharmacist or pharmacy; and

(ii) Provides reasonable notice to the pharmacist or pharmacy of the allegation of fraud and the basis of the allegation before initiating an action.

(2) A pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy benefit manager affiliate shall not penalize or retaliate against a pharmacist, pharmacy or pharmacy employee for exercising any rights under this chapter, initiating any judicial or regulatory actions or discussing or disclosing information pertaining to an agreement with a pharmacy benefit manager or a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate when testifying or otherwise appearing before any governmental agency, legislative member or body or any judicial authority.

SECTION 8. Section 73-21-163, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

73-21-163. (1) Whenever the Board has reason to believe that a pharmacy benefit manager, ~~or~~ pharmacy benefit manager affiliate, or pharmacy services administrative organization is using, has used, or is about to use any method, act or practice prohibited in Sections 73-21-151 through 73-21-163 and that proceedings would be in the public interest, it may bring an action in the name of the Board against the pharmacy benefit manager, ~~or~~ pharmacy benefit manager affiliate, or pharmacy services administrative organization to restrain by temporary or permanent injunction the use of such method, act or practice. The action shall be brought in the Chancery Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi. The court is authorized to issue temporary or permanent injunctions to restrain and prevent violations of Sections 73-21-151 through 73-21-163 and such injunctions shall be issued without bond.

(2) The Bboard may impose a monetary penalty on a pharmacy benefit manager, ~~or~~ a pharmacy benefit manager affiliate, or pharmacy services administrative organization for noncompliance with the provisions of the Sections 73-21-151 through 73-21-163, in amounts of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per violation and not more than Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per violation. Each day a violation continues for the same brand or generic product identifier or brand or generic code number is a separate violation. Each day that a pharmacy benefit manager or pharmacy services administrative organization does business in this state without a license is deemed a separate violation. The Bboard shall prepare a record entered upon its minutes that states the basic facts upon which the monetary penalty was imposed. Any penalty collected under this subsection (2) shall be deposited into the special fund of the Bboard.

(3) For the purposes of conducting investigations, the Board, through its executive director, may conduct audits and examinations of a pharmacy benefit manager and may also issue subpoenas to any individual, pharmacy, pharmacy benefit manager, or any other entity having documents or records that it deems relevant to the investigation.

(~~34~~) The Bboard may assess a monetary penalty for those reasonable costs that are expended by the Bboard in the investigation and conduct of a proceeding if the Bboard imposes a monetary penalty under subsection (2) of this section. A monetary penalty assessed and levied under this section shall be paid to the Bboard by the licensee, registrant or permit holder upon the expiration of the period allowed for appeal of those penalties under Section 73-21-101, or may be paid sooner if the licensee, registrant or permit holder elects. Any penalty collected by the Bboard under this subsection (~~34~~) shall be deposited into the special fund of the Bboard.

(45) When payment of a monetary penalty assessed and levied by the Board against a licensee, registrant or permit holder in accordance with this section is not paid by the licensee, registrant or permit holder when due under this section, the Board shall have the power to institute and maintain proceedings in its name for enforcement of payment in the chancery court of the county and judicial district of residence of the licensee, registrant or permit holder, or if the licensee, registrant or permit holder is a nonresident of the State of Mississippi, in the Chancery Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi. When those proceedings are instituted, the Board shall certify the record of its proceedings, together with all documents and evidence, to the chancery court and the matter shall be heard in due course by the court, which shall review the record and make its determination thereon in accordance with the provisions of Section 73-21-101. The hearing on the matter may, in the discretion of the chancellor, be tried in vacation.

(6)(a) The Board may conduct audits to ensure compliance with the provisions of this Act. In conducting audits, the Board is empowered to request production of documents pertaining to compliance with the provisions of this Act, and documents so requested shall be produced within seven (7) days of the request unless extended by the Board or its duly authorized staff.

(b) The pharmacy benefit manager being audited shall pay all costs of such audit if such audit reveals any noncompliance with this Act. The cost of the audit examination shall be deposited into the special fund and shall be used by the Board, upon appropriation of the Legislature, to support the operations of the Board relating to the regulation of pharmacy benefit managers.

(c) The Board is authorized to hire independent consultants to conduct audits of a pharmacy benefit manager and expend funds collected under this section to pay the cost of performing audit services.

(57) The Bboard shall develop and implement a uniform penalty policy that sets the minimum and maximum penalty for any given violation of Sections 73-21-151 through 73-21-163. The Bboard shall adhere to its uniform penalty policy except in those cases where the Bboard specifically finds, by majority vote, that a penalty in excess of, or less than, the uniform penalty is appropriate. That vote shall be reflected in the minutes of the Bboard and shall not be imposed unless it appears as having been adopted by the Bboard.

SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2025.

(Prescription Monitoring Program Claims Data Sharing)

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 2 modifies, revises, and amends the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the **DIVISION OF MEDICAID IN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR**, an administrative agency of the **STATE OF MISSISSIPPI**, hereinafter referred to as "DOM", and the **MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF PHARMACY**, hereinafter referred to as "BOP".

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of Miss. Code Ann. § 43-13-101, *et. seq.* (1972, as amended), DOM is designated as the single state agency authorized and empowered to administer the Medical Assistance Program as enacted by the Mississippi State Legislature in compliance with Title XIX of the Federal Social Security Act, as amended;

WHEREAS, DOM currently has an agreement with University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy for the provision of retrospective drug utilization review, Drug Utilization Review Board facilitation, analytical support for clinical rule development and special projects, and second level appeals from the prior authorization ("PA") process, as well as other related services (collectively referred to herein as "DUR");

WHEREAS, beginning in 2015, DOM identified a need for obtaining prescription monitoring program claims data on Medicaid program recipients from the BOP, as authorized by Miss. Code Ann. § 73-21-127 and included this need and continues to include this need in the DUR contract;

WHEREAS, DOM and BOP extended the term of this MOU through Amendment No. 1;

WHEREAS, the need for this MOU is continuous, and DOM and BOP desire to extend the term of the MOU for the final year through this Amendment No. 2 pursuant to Article III (Term); and,

WHEREAS, Article VII (Modification or Amendment) of the MOU provides that the MOU may be modified or amended if such modification or amendment is mutually agreed upon in writing by DOM and the BOP.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual undertaking and conditions as hereinafter set forth, the MOU is amended as follows:

1. **Article III, TERM,** is hereby amended to read as follows:

II. TERM: The term of this MOU shall commence on January 1, 2021, and shall remain in force through December 31, 2025, unless terminated earlier by any party in accordance with Article VIII (Termination).

2. **Article XXIV. DATA PROTECTIONS,** is hereby included as an additional Article to this MOU:

XXIV. DATA PROTECTIONS: Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-127(1)(e)(i) authorizes the BOP to provide confidential collected information to the DOM regarding Medicaid and Medicare Program recipients. This data will be provided pursuant to Article 1. Objectives.

The DOM acknowledges that its DUR vendor will be the custodian of the Medicaid claims data provided by the BOP, and its DUR vendor will be solely responsible for establishing and maintaining appropriate administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to prevent unauthorized access to or use of these files, including but not limited to, security awareness training and signed rules of behavior for all persons who have access to the Medicaid claims data information, strong passwords and auditing for all access to, approved encryption of collected information stored digitally.

The DOM agrees to immediately notify the BOP in the event that the DOM is requested to release Medicaid claims data provided by BOP under this MOU for a purpose other than that outlined in this MOU in order to afford the BOP an opportunity to review such request for approval. In the event DOM is required to disclose such information as required by law or the legal process, BOP shall be provided notice of required disclosure without unreasonable delay.

3. All other terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the Original MOU and any preceding Amendments, other than those modified and amended herein, shall remain in full force and effect for the duration of the MOU.

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

MD Pharmaceutical Supply, is alleged to have committed a violation of Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-105 (1) which provides in relevant part:

Every facility/business that engages in the wholesale distribution of prescription drugs, to include without limitation, manufacturing in this state, distribution into this state, or selling or offering to sell in this state, or distribution from or within this state, and every reverse distributor located in or outside this of state that conducts business with pharmacies in this state, shall register biennially or annually, to be determined by the board, with the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy by applying for a permit on a form supplied by the board and accompanied by a fee as set by subsection (4) of this section.

Specifically, MD Pharmaceutical Supply distributed prescription drug products into the State of Mississippi including, but not limited to, shipping prescription drug products to Madison Medical Compounding Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 17118/2.6, in Madison, Mississippi on April 2, 2024, and has not obtained a permit from the Board to operate as a wholesale drug distributor.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Pursuant to discussions between Board Counsel and the Respondent, an Agreement to Settle this matter is found to be in the best interest of all parties involved. It is hereby Agreed as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The Respondent was properly notified of the charges by a duly processed "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges as provided for in



STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Super Drugs Pharmacy, Permit to Operate as a Pharmacy, Permit Number 07906/1.1, is alleged to have committed the following violations:

Mississippi Board of Pharmacy Administrative Rules, Rule 2.1 F:

Violation of any of the provisions of the Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Act or rules or regulations adopted pursuant to such Act; or violation of pharmacy or drug laws of any other state or the federal government or the rules/regulations pertaining thereto.

Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations Article XXXI, COMPOUNDING GUIDELINES:

Every pharmacy permitted by the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy engaged in the compounding of pharmaceuticals that is not a licensed 503B pharmacy following good manufacturing practices (GMP) shall comply with USP 795, USP 797, and USP 800 when compounding in the scope of those chapters. The designated facility USP representative must be a pharmacist licensed in the State of Mississippi.

USP 797 provides in relevant part:

Section 1. Introduction and Scope

Aseptic techniques, processes and procedures must be followed for preparing any sterile medication.

Section 2. Personnel Training and Evaluation (Ongoing Training and Competency)

2.1, 2.2, 2.3- Personnel who compound or have direct oversight of compounding personnel must complete training initially and at least every 12 months in appropriate sterile compounding principles and practices as described (including aseptic technique, garbing, maintaining sterility, documentation of the compounding process, etc). Further USP 797 provides that

compounding personnel must complete garbing competencies including gloved fingertip testing at least once every 6 months for Category 1 and 2 and every 3 months for Category 3 CSPs (compounded sterile preparations). Media fill testing must occur once every 6 months for Category 1 and 2 CSPs and every 3 months for Category 3 CSPs.

Section 4. Facilities and Engineering Controls

4.1.2- Facilities used for compounding CSPs must be designed so that air quality improves with movement through separate operational areas to the PEC (Primary Engineering Control).

4.2.1 The PEC must be located in the buffer room of the cleanroom suite or the SCA in a manner that minimizes conditions that could increase the risk of microbial contamination. For example, strong air currents from opened doors, personnel traffic, or air streams from the HVAC system can disrupt the unidirectional airflow of an open-faced PEC.

4.5-Placement and Movement of Materials- No shipping carton (s) or other corrugated or uncoated cardboard are allowed in a classified area or SCA.

Section 5. Certification and Recertification

Certification of the classified areas including the PEC must be performed initially, and recertification must be performed at least every 6 months.

Section 6. Microbiological Air and Surface Monitoring

6.2.1- Volumetric active air sampling of all classified areas using an impaction air sampler must be conducted in each classified area during dynamic operating conditions. For Category 1 and 2 CSPs, this must be completed at least every 6 months. For Category 3 CSPs, at least 30 days prior to compounding Category 3 and at least monthly thereafter.

6.3.1- Surface Sampling in the DCA must also be conducted in conjunction with media-fill testing to assess aseptic manipulation competency. Additionally, for Category 1 and 2 CSPs, surface sampling of all classified areas, and pass-through chambers connecting classified areas, must be conducted at least monthly. For Category 3 CSPs, surface sampling must be completed prior to assigning a BUD longer than the established limits and at least weekly for classified areas and pass through chambers connecting to classified areas. Surface sampling is conducted within the PEC used to prepare Category 3 CSPs at the end of each batch before cleaning and disinfecting.

Section 7. Cleaning, Disinfecting, and Applying Sporicidal Disinfectants and Sterile 70% IPA

7.1.1- Cleaning, disinfecting and sporicidal agents used within the PEC must be sterile. In classified areas outside of the PEC, sterile cleaning and disinfecting agents should be used.

Section 8. Introducing Items into the SEC (secondary engineering control) and PEC

8.2-Just before any item is introduced into the PEC, it must be wiped with sterile 70% IPA using sterile low-lint wipers and allowed to dry before use.

Section 11. Master Formulation (MFR) and Compounding Records (CR)

11.1- An MFR must be created for all CSPs prepared from nonsterile ingredients or CSPs prepared for more than one patient. The MFR must include at least the following information: name, strength or activity, and dosage form of the CSP; identities and amounts of all

ingredients; type and size of container closure systems, complete instructions for preparing the CSP (including equipment, supplies, a description of compounding steps, and any special precautions; physical description of the final CSP; BUD and storage requirements; reference source to support the stability of the CSP; quality control procedures; other information as needed to describe the compounding process and ensure repeatability

11.2-Compounding records must include at least the following information: name, strength or activity, and dosage form of the CSP; date and time of preparation of the CSP; assigned internal identification number; a method to identify the individuals involved in the compounding process and individuals verifying the final CSP; name of each component; strength or activity of each component; total quantity compounded; final yield (quantity, containers, number of units); assigned BUD (beyond use date) and storage requirements; results of QC (quality control) procedures (visual inspection, filter integrity testing, pH testing); if applicable, the CR must also include: MFR reference for the CSP, calculations made to determine and verify quantities and/or concentrations of components

Section 13. Labeling

The labeling on the immediate container must at a minimum display the following:

- Assigned internal identification number (e.g., barcode, prescription, order, or lot number)
- Active ingredient(s) and their amount(s), activity(ies), or concentration(s)
- Storage conditions if other than controlled room temperature
- BUD
- Dosage form
- Total amount or volume if it is not obvious from the container
- If it is a single-dose container, a statement stating such when space permits
- If it is a multiple-dose container, a statement stating such

The labeling on the CSP must display the following information, as applicable:

- Route(s) of administration
- Special handling instructions
- Warning statements
- Compounding facility name and contact information if the CSP is to be sent outside of the facility or healthcare system in which it was compounded.

Section 14. Establishing Beyond Use Dates

14.2-BUDs for CSPs should be established conservatively to ensure that the drug maintains its required characteristics (i.e. stability and sterility) until its BUD.

When establishing a BUD for a CSP, compounders must consider parameters that may affect quality, including but not limited to:

- Chemical and physical stability properties of the drug and/or its formulation
- Materials of composition of the container closure system and compatibility of the container closure system with the final preparation (e.g., leachables, interactions, adsorption, and storage conditions)

Section 18. Quality Assurance and Quality Control

QA is a system of procedures, activities, and oversight that ensures that the compounding process consistently meets quality standards. QC is the sampling, testing, and documentation of results that, taken together, ensure that specifications have been met before release of the CSP. A facility's QA and QC programs must be formally established and documented in the facility's SOPs that ensure that all aspects of the preparation of CSPs are conducted in accordance with the requirements in this chapter (797) and the laws and regulations of the applicable regulatory jurisdiction.

Specifically, a USP 797 compounding inspection was conducted at Super Drugs Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 07906/1.1, on May 10, 2024. The following violations were noted:

Violation of USP 797 Section 1:

Aseptic techniques, processes and procedures were not followed. The compounder, (Jake O'Bannon), manipulated drug product with first air completely blocked by a hot plate. The compounder worked outside of the direct compounding area (DCA). In addition, manipulations were made at the edge of the hood and even outside of the hood. These observations are considered outside of practice for aseptic technique.

Violation of USP 797 Section 2:

A review of training documentation revealed the last documented training for sterile compounder, Jake O'Bannon, was in 2021. Media fill testing was last documented for Jake O'Bannon in July 2023.

Violation of USP 797 Section 4:

The doors to the buffer room from the pre-sterilization room and ante room were all open during compounding. Additionally, corrugated cardboard was in the anteroom.

Violation of USP 797 Section 5:

The last hood and room certifications were conducted on October 19, 2023.

Violation of USP 797 Section 6:

Monthly surface samples were not being conducted monthly. The most recent samples were completed on February 28, 2024.

Violation of USP 797 Section 7:

A sterile cleaner was not being used inside the ISO-5 area.

Violation of USP 797 Section 8:

Compounder Jake O'Bannon did not wipe down items placed in the hood with 70% isopropyl alcohol prior to placing the items in the hood.

Violation of USP 797 Section 11:

The master formulation record/compounding record for Semaglutide did not contain all required information.

Violation of USP 797 Section 13:

Labels on immediate containers lacked required information.

Violation of USP 797 Section 14:

Semaglutide and tirzepatide doses were drawn up and placed in the freezer in BD syringes with no stability studies having been conducted in house nor documentation of outside stability studies to support the chosen BUD (beyond use dating).

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges was served pursuant to statute.
- (2) The Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law.
- (3) The Respondent was issued a Permit to Operate a Pharmacy Number 07906/1.1, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (4) The Respondent committed the violations as charged.

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondent and a copy maintained on file in the office of the Board.

- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(c), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent, Super Drugs Pharmacy, Permit to Operate as a Pharmacy, Permit Number 07906/1.1, shall be restricted to immediately suspend all sterile compounding and the dispensing of sterile compounded drugs. All drugs that were compounded prior to the date of this Order shall be destroyed or forfeited to the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(i), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the 1st violation.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(ii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for each of the 2nd through 10th violation for a monetary penalty amount of Twenty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$27,000.00).
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay and the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- The total monetary penalty and cost of investigation in the amount of Twenty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$29,000.00) shall be paid by the Respondent with Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) due December 1, 2024 and monthly payments of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) due the 1st of the month beginning January 1, 2025 with the final payment due on May 1, 2025.
- The Respondent shall petition the Board, no earlier than January 16, 2025, to have the above compounding restrictions on Permit Number 07906/1.1 lifted and shall appear before the

Board to present evidence of compliance with all compounding rules and standards prior to the Board lifting the compounding restriction.







11.2-Compounding records must include at least the following information: name, strength or activity, and dosage form of the CSP; date and time of preparation of the CSP; assigned internal identification number; a method to identify the individuals involved in the compounding process and individuals verifying the final CSP; name of each component; strength or activity of each component; total quantity compounded; final yield (quantity, containers, number of units); assigned BUD (beyond use date) and storage requirements; results of QC (quality control) procedures (visual inspection, filter integrity testing, pH testing); if applicable, the CR must also include: MFR reference for the CSP, calculations made to determine and verify quantities and/or concentrations of components

Section 13. Labeling

The labeling on the immediate container must at a minimum display the following:

- Assigned internal identification number (e.g., barcode, prescription, order, or lot number)
- Active ingredient(s) and their amount(s), activity(ies), or concentration(s)
- Storage conditions if other than controlled room temperature
- BUD
- Dosage form
- Total amount or volume if it is not obvious from the container
- If it is a single-dose container, a statement stating such when space permits
- If it is a multiple-dose container, a statement stating such

The labeling on the CSP must display the following information, as applicable:

- Route(s) of administration
- Special handling instructions
- Warning statements
- Compounding facility name and contact information if the CSP is to be sent outside of the facility or healthcare system in which it was compounded.

Section 14. Establishing Beyond Use Dates

14.2-BUDs for CSPs should be established conservatively to ensure that the drug maintains its required characteristics (i.e. stability and sterility) until its BUD.

When establishing a BUD for a CSP, compounders must consider parameters that may affect quality, including but not limited to:

- Chemical and physical stability properties of the drug and/or its formulation

- *Materials of composition of the container closure system and compatibility of the container closure system with the final preparation (e.g., leachables, interactions, adsorption, and storage conditions)*

Section 18. Quality Assurance and Quality Control

QA is a system of procedures, activities, and oversight that ensures that the compounding process consistently meets quality standards. QC is the sampling, testing, and documentation of results that, taken together, ensure that specifications have been met before release of the CSP.

A facility's QA and QC programs must be formally established and documented in the facility's SOPs that ensure that all aspects of the preparation of CSPs are conducted in accordance with the requirements in this chapter (797) and the laws and regulations of the applicable regulatory jurisdiction.

Specifically, a USP 797 compounding inspection was conducted at Super Drugs Pharmacy, Pharmacy Permit Number 07906/1.1, on May 10, 2024. Eddie D. O'Bannon, Pharmacist License, Certificate of Registration Number T-08835, is the pharmacist-in-charge (PIC), and responsible for complete supervision, management and compliance with all federal and state pharmacy laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy in the entire prescription department.

The following violations were noted:

Violation of USP 797 Section 1:

Aseptic techniques, processes and procedures were not followed. The compounder, (Jake O'Bannon), manipulated drug product with first air completely blocked by a hot plate. The compounder worked outside of the direct compounding area (DCA). In addition, manipulations were made at the edge of the hood and even outside of the hood. These observations are considered outside of practice for aseptic technique.

Violation of USP 797 Section 2:

A review of training documentation revealed the last documented training for sterile compounder, Jake O'Bannon, was in 2021. Media fill testing was last documented for Jake O'Bannon in July 2023.

Violation of USP 797 Section 4:

The doors to the buffer room from the pre-sterilization room and ante room were all open during compounding. Additionally, corrugated cardboard was in the anteroom.

Violation of USP 797 Section 5:

The last hood and room certifications were conducted on October 19, 2023.

Violation of USP 797 Section 6:

Monthly surface samples were not being conducted monthly. The most recent samples were completed on February 28, 2024.

Violation of USP 797 Section 7:

A sterile cleaner was not being used inside the ISO-5 area.

Violation of USP 797 Section 8:

Compounder Jake O'Bannon did not wipe down items placed in the hood with 70% isopropyl alcohol prior to placing the items in the hood.

Violation of USP 797 Section 11:

The master formulation record/compounding record for Semaglutide did not contain all required information.

Violation of USP 797 Section 13:

Labels on immediate containers lacked required information.

Violation of USP 797 Section 14:

Semaglutide and tirzepatide doses were drawn up and placed in the freezer in BD syringes with no stability studies having been conducted in house nor documentation of outside stability studies to support the chosen BUD.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Pursuant to discussions between Board Counsel and Counsel for the Respondent, an Agreement to Settle this matter is found to be in the best interest of all parties involved. It is hereby Agreed as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The Respondent was properly notified of the charges by a duly processed "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges as provided for in Section 73-21-99, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, and the Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law.
- (2) The Respondent was issued a license to practice pharmacy by the Board, Certificate of Registration Number T-08835, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (l)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (3) The Respondent does not contest the violations as charged.
- (4) The Respondent agrees to the disciplinary action stated below as imposed by the Board.

FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondent and a copy maintained on file in the office of the Board.

- Pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-103(l)(c), Pharmacist License, Certificate of Registration Number T-08835 shall be restricted from serving as a pharmacist-in-charge (PIC). This restriction can only be removed by the respondent petitioning and appearing before the Board to remove the restriction. The Board will not entertain a petition from the Respondent to remove this restriction prior to one (1) year from the date of this Order.


- Pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-103 (l)(d), Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).
- Pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-103 (l)(d)(iii), Respondent shall pay the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).
- The total monetary settlement of Five Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$5,100.00) is due and payable in the office of the Board within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Order.

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Express Scripts, Pharmacy Benefit Manager Permit #140117/14.1 is alleged to have committed the following violations:

Violation of Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-156 (4):

- (4) A pharmacy benefit manager shall:
 - (a) Provide a reasonable administrative appeal procedure to allow pharmacies to challenge a maximum allowable cost list and reimbursements made under a maximum allowable cost list for a specific drug or drugs as:
 - (i) Not meeting the requirements of this section; or
 - (ii) Being below the pharmacy acquisition cost.
 - (b) The reasonable administrative appeal procedure shall include the following:
 - (i) A dedicated telephone number, email address and website for the purpose of submitting administrative appeals;
 - (ii) The ability to submit an administrative appeal directly to the pharmacy benefit manager regarding the pharmacy benefit management plan or through a pharmacy service administrative organization; and
 - (iii) A period of less than thirty (30) business days to file an administrative appeal.
 - (c) The pharmacy benefit manager shall respond to the challenge under paragraph (a) of this subsection (4) within thirty (30) business days after receipt of the challenge.
 - (d) If a challenge is made under paragraph (a) of this subsection (4), the pharmacy benefit manager shall within thirty (30) business days after receipt of the challenge either:
 - (i) If the appeal is upheld:
 - 1. Make the change in the maximum allowable cost list payment to at least the pharmacy acquisition cost;
 - 2. Permit the challenging pharmacy or pharmacist to reverse and rebill the claim in question;

3. Provide the National Drug Code that the increase or change is based on to the pharmacy or pharmacist; and
 4. Make the change under item 1 of this subparagraph (i) effective for each similarly situated pharmacy as defined by the payor subject to the maximum allowable cost list; or
- (ii) If the appeal is denied, provide the challenging pharmacy or pharmacist the National Drug Code and the name of the national or regional pharmaceutical wholesalers operating in Mississippi that have the drug currently in stock at a price below the maximum allowable cost as listed on the maximum allowable cost list; or
- (iii) If the National Drug Code provided by the pharmacy benefit manager is not available below the pharmacy acquisition cost from the pharmaceutical wholesaler from whom the pharmacy or pharmacist purchases the majority of prescription drugs for resale, then the pharmacy benefit manager shall adjust the maximum allowable cost as listed on the maximum allowable cost list above the challenging pharmacy's pharmacy acquisition cost and permit the pharmacy to reverse and rebill each claim affected by the inability to procure the drug at a cost that is equal to or less than the previously challenged maximum allowable cost.

Count 1: Specifically, Express Scripts, Pharmacy Benefit Manager Permit #140117/14.1, failed to comply with Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-156 (4)(d)(i)(4) by approving prescription drug claim appeals filed by Mississippi pharmacies but failing to make a change in the maximum allowable cost list payment to at least the pharmacy acquisition cost for each similarly situated pharmacy as defined by the payor subject to the maximum allowable cost list when a claim appeal for a specific National Drug Code has been previously upheld or approved by the pharmacy benefit manager.

Count 2: Specifically, Express Scripts, Pharmacy Benefit Manager Permit #140117/14.1, failed to comply with Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-156 (4)(d)(ii) by denying prescription drug claim appeals filed by Mississippi pharmacies and not providing the challenging pharmacy or pharmacist the National Drug Code and the name of the national or regional pharmaceutical wholesalers operating in Mississippi that have the drug currently in stock at a price below the maximum allowable cost as listed on the maximum allowable cost list.

Count 3: Specifically, Express Scripts, Pharmacy Benefit Manager Permit #140117/14.1, failed to comply with Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-21-156 (4)(d)(iii) when the National Drug Code provided by the pharmacy benefit manager is not available below the pharmacy acquisition cost from the pharmaceutical wholesaler from whom the pharmacy or pharmacist purchases the majority of prescription drugs for resale by either:

1. Failing to adjust the maximum allowable cost as listed on the maximum allowable cost list above the challenging pharmacy's pharmacy acquisition cost and permitting the pharmacy to reverse and rebill each claim affected by the inability to procure the drug at a cost that is equal to or less than the previously challenged maximum allowable cost, or
2. Resolving the appeal without providing an appeal procedure which would allow a pharmacy to notify the pharmacy benefit manager of the pharmacy's inability to procure the drug at a cost that is equal to or less than the previously challenged maximum allowable cost.

ORDER OF THE BOARD

Prior to hearing any evidence, the Board tabled this matter until the November 21, 2024, board meeting to allow more time for negotiations on a potential settlement.



Count 1:

Violation of Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations, Article XLVII Physician Dispensing Facility Permits, Section 3, Paragraph 1:

Section 3: Storage and Dispensing Conditions

1. All drug products which are stored or maintained in a facility permitted by the Board of Pharmacy shall remain in the manufacturer's or repackager's original container. The label of any container in which drugs are maintained must bear the drug name, strength, the manufacturer's control lot number and the expiration date. Drugs which are precounted and prepackaged, or placed in automatic tablet counting machines, for purposes of dispensing shall be identifiable as to expiration date and manufacturer's control lot number. The containers in which drug products are maintained shall not be labeled in any false or misleading manner. The labeling requirements of this ARTICLE are in addition to, and not in lieu of, other labeling requirements of the laws of the state of Mississippi and laws of the United States or federal regulations.

Specifically, an inspection on November 20, 2023, revealed that multiple drug products had been predrawn into syringes without labels to indicate the drug name, strength, the manufacturer's control lot number or the expiration date.

Count 2:

Violation of Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations, Article XLVII Physician Dispensing Facility Permits, Section 3, Paragraph 2:

Section 3: Storage and Dispensing Conditions

2. No physician may delegate dispensing authority to another person. Except as allowed pursuant to an automated dispensing physician facility permit, a physician must personally dispense the medication. For the purpose of this regulation, "personally dispense" means the physician must actually obtain the medication, prepare, count, place the medication into the appropriate container and affix the appropriate label to the container.

Specifically, an inspection on November 20, 2023, revealed that medications were being dispensed without the physician present.

Count 3:

Violation of Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations, Article XLVII Physician Dispensing Facility Permits, Section 4:

Section 4: Labeling

The label on the dispensing container shall include:

1. The name and address of the patient to whom the medication was dispensed;
2. The date that the medication was dispensed;
3. The drug name, manufacturer or distributor name and lot number of the drug product dispensed;
4. The strength and quantity of the medication;
5. Directions for taking or administering the medication;
6. The name and address of the physician dispensing the medication, and
7. Any other information which is necessary or required.

The label shall be affixed to the outside of the container of the dispensed medication by means of adhesive or tape or any other means which will assure that the label remains attached to the container.

Specifically, an inspection on November 20, 2023, revealed multiple dispensing containers without the required label.

Count 4:

Violation of Mississippi Pharmacy Practice Regulations, Article XLVII Physician Dispensing Facility Permits, Section 5:

Section 5: Security

In all places where controlled substances are maintained, they shall be maintained in a manner to deter loss by theft or burglary. Storage of controlled substances in any schedule may be made in a securely locked, substantially constructed container or area; or they may be dispersed throughout the stock of non-controlled substances in such a manner as to obstruct the theft or diversion of the controlled substances; or they may be stored by a combination of these methods. Only the

dispensing physician or person authorized by the dispensing physician shall have access to this storage area.

Specifically, an inspection on November 20, 2023, revealed that controlled substance medications were not being stored securely.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, after being presented clear and convincing evidence, makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The "Notice of Hearing and Complaint" along with a sworn affidavit detailing those charges was served pursuant to statute.
- (2) The Respondent has been afforded all due process required by law and was represented by counsel.
- (3) The Respondent was issued a Physician Dispensing Facility Permit Number 00007/18.1, and as such was subject to jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Section 73-21-97 (1)(f), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.
- (4) The Respondent committed Count 1 and Count 4 as charged.
- (5) Counts 2 and 3 are dismissed.


FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD

This ORDER OF THE BOARD is effective immediately. A certified copy of this ORDER shall be served on the Respondent and a copy maintained on file in the office of the Board.


- Count 2 and Count 3 are dismissed.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(i), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a violation of Count 1.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(ii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a violation of Count 4.
- Pursuant to Section 73-21-103(1)(d)(iii), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, Respondent shall pay the cost of investigation and conduct of a proceeding in the amount of Two Hundred Forty Dollars and Ten Cents (\$240.10).
- The total monetary penalty of Six Thousand Two Hundred Fourteen Dollars and Ten Cents (\$6,214.10) is due and payable in the office of the Board within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Order. The monetary penalty shall be paid electronically through the Board of Pharmacy licensing system or by certified check, attorney's check or money order issued by a usual, customary, and reputable issuer (U.S. Postal Money Order, Western Union Money Order, etc.).

All members participating in the hearing affirmed this Order. Board Member Ronnie Bagwell recused himself from voting on the Order.

JURISDICTION

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy has jurisdiction of the subject matter pursuant to Section 73-21-103(2), Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.

PROCEEDINGS

The Mississippi Board of Pharmacy entered an Order on February 17, 2022, which revoked the license of the Petitioner for addiction to or dependence on alcohol, controlled substances or other habit-forming legend drugs or the unauthorized use, possession or theft of controlled substances or other habit-forming legend drugs. The Board also imposed a penalty in the amount of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) and charged the Respondent for the cost of investigation in the amount of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). On September 15, 2022, the Petitioner appeared before the Board with a request to reinstate the license of the Petitioner. No action was taken by the Board and the request of the Petitioner was denied. On March 23, 2023, the Petitioner appeared before the Board with a request to reinstate the license of Petitioner. The Board affirmed the request and reinstated the license of the Petitioner with several restrictions and allowed him to pay the Two Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$2,250.00) penalty and costs issued in the February 17, 2022, Board Order over a twelve (12) month payment period. On September 21, 2023, Petitioner appeared before the Board with a request to remove the restrictions on his license. The Board denied the request of the Petitioner and ordered the Petitioner not appear before the Board on the matter until at least one (1) year from the date of the Order. The Petitioner requests the Board remove some of the restrictions on his license.

The Board heard testimony concerning the request of the Petitioner.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Based upon the clear and convincing evidence presented at the petition hearing, all members of the Board present voted to approve the request by the Petitioner to remove the following restrictions on his license:

- The Petitioner shall only work day shifts.
- The Petitioner is not authorized to work in a pharmacy alone, but rather shall work with another pharmacist.
- The Petitioner is not authorized to have a key to the pharmacy in which he works.
- The Petitioner shall have a workplace monitor who is informed by the Petitioner of his history in order to be adequately observed in the workplace.

The following restriction is added on the license of the Petitioner:

- The Petitioner is only authorized to practice pharmacy at Home Care Medical, Pharmacy Permit Number 05882/2.0 and Advanced Medical Inc., Pharmacy Permit Number 18519/2.0.

The following restrictions remain in effect:

- The Petitioner shall enter into a contract with the Mississippi Association of Recovering Pharmacists ("MARP") and comply with the terms of that contract, which shall include random drug and alcohol screens, including the use of Peth blood alcohol testing and hair sample testing. The MARP contract shall expire on March 22, 2033.
- Petitioner shall abstain from the use of alcohol or the unauthorized use of controlled substances or other habit-forming legend drugs.
- Petitioner shall not take any mood-altering drug which has not been prescribed for him.
- Petitioner shall immediately inform the Board in writing (by email or fax) of all medications prescribed for him, stating the name of the drug, the number and strength of the doses prescribed, the dosage regimen and the name and registration number of the prescriber.
- The Petitioner shall submit a urine specimen, serum specimen or hair sample when requested by the Board or any agent of the Board of Pharmacy.
- The Petitioner's access to controlled medications shall be monitored.
- The Petitioner is not authorized to work in a supervisory role.
- The Petitioner is not authorized to work more than fifty (50) hours per week.
- Petitioner shall keep the Board informed at all times as to place of his employment as a Pharmacist and any change in residential address.
- Petitioner shall submit a written quarterly report (on a form prescribed by the Board) to the Board, due the first week of January, April, July, and October, detailing his personal and professional well-being.

The Petitioner shall not be placed on the agenda on this matter until at least one (1) year from the date of this Order.


